14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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16	Section 1. (1) The Florida High School Athletic
17	Association shall, until July 1, 2007, hold in abeyance the
18	2006-2007 revisions to sections 11.01, 11.02, 11.2, 11.3, and
19	11.4, Bylaws of the Florida High School Athletic Association,
20	relating to student athlete residence and transfer, adopted
21	pursuant to s. 1006.20, Florida Statutes.
22	(2) A Student Athlete Recruiting Task Force shall be
23	created to review issues concerning recruiting of secondary
24	school student athletes. The task force shall make
25	recommendations that preserve the parental right to school
26	choice while protecting the integrity of Florida's
27	interscholastic athletic programs. The task force shall
28	consider:

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29 The definition of recruiting. (a) Current and proposed procedures governing recruiting 30 (b) of secondary school student athletes. 31 32 Documented past recruiting practices and violations. (C) Practices to be reviewed shall include, but not be limited to, 33 the provision of tuition scholarships and other inducements, 34 35 recruitment of foreign athletes, and active solicitation of student athletes and parents by school employees or boosters. 36 (d) 37 The impact of student athlete recruiting rules on 38 parental school choice. 39 The relationship between student athlete transfers and (e) recruiting, including the role of student athlete transfer rules 40 41 in preventing recruiting. 42 Measures for preventing improper student athlete (f) 43 recruiting and penalties for recruiting violations. 44 (3) The task force shall be comprised of representatives from home school and public and private secondary school 45 proponents and opponents of the 2006-2007 revisions to the 46 47 bylaws specified in subsection (1). The task force members shall 48 be appointed as follows: 49 Three proponents of the bylaws and three opponents of (a) 50 the bylaws each appointed by the President of the Senate. Three proponents of the bylaws and three opponents of 51 (b) the bylaws each appointed by the Speaker of the House of 52 53 Representatives. (c) A task force chair appointed by the Governor. 54

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55 Task force members shall serve without compensation (4) 56 but shall be reimbursed for per diem and travel expenses in accordance with s. 112.061, Florida Statutes. 57 58 The task force shall be staffed by the Office of (5) 59 Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability and be monitored by the Department of Education. The chair shall 60 61 convene meetings of the task force as needed and shall ensure 62 that the recommendations are completed and forwarded on time. 63 (6) The task force shall hold its initial meeting not later than June 1, 2006, and shall submit its recommendations to 64 the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of 65 the House of Representatives by January 1, 2007. The task force 66 67 shall dissolve upon rendering its recommendations. Section 2. The Office of Program Policy Analysis and 68 Government Accountability shall conduct an independent review of 69 70 secondary school recruiting violations among Florida High School Athletic Association member schools and shall have full access 71 72 to Florida High School Athletic Association records for the 73 purpose of this review. Section 3. The sum of \$60,000 is appropriated from the 74 75 General Revenue Fund to the Office of Program Policy Analysis 76 and Government Accountability for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to 77 support the work of the Student Athlete Recruiting Task Force. 78 The sum of \$50,000 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government 79 80 Accountability for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to fund its independent review of secondary school recruiting violations. 81 82 Section 4.
