(b) In the enactment of general laws on other subjects,
political subdivisions or other governmental entities may be
classified only on a basis reasonably related to the subject of
the law.

ARTICLE IV

EXECUTIVE

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SECTION 4. Cabinet.--

(a) There shall be a cabinet composed of an attorney general, a chief financial officer, <u>a commissioner of the</u> <u>interior</u>, and a commissioner of agriculture. In addition to the powers and duties specified herein, they shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be prescribed by law. In the event of a tie vote of the governor and cabinet, the side on which the governor voted shall be deemed to prevail.

The attorney general shall be the chief state legal 76 (b) 77 officer. There is created in the office of the attorney general 78 the position of statewide prosecutor. The statewide prosecutor 79 shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the state attorneys to prosecute violations of criminal laws occurring or having 80 occurred, in two or more judicial circuits as part of a related 81 transaction, or when any such offense is affecting or has 82 affected two or more judicial circuits as provided by general 83 law. The statewide prosecutor shall be appointed by the attorney 84 Page 3 of 8

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general from not less than three persons nominated by the judicial nominating commission for the supreme court, or as otherwise provided by general law.

(c) The chief financial officer shall serve as the chief fiscal officer of the state, and shall settle and approve accounts against the state, and shall keep all state funds and securities.

92 (d) The commissioner of agriculture shall have supervision
93 of matters pertaining to agriculture except as otherwise
94 provided by law.

95 (e) The commissioner of the interior shall have 96 supervision of matters pertaining to the state's natural 97 resources and scenic beauty, including fish and wildlife, except 98 as otherwise provided by law.

99 <u>(f)(e)</u> The governor as chair, the chief financial officer, 100 and the attorney general shall constitute the state board of 101 administration, which shall succeed to all the power, control, 102 and authority of the state board of administration established 103 pursuant to Article IX, Section 16 of the Constitution of 1885, 104 and which shall continue as a body at least for the life of 105 Article XII, Section 9(c).

106 <u>(g)(f)</u> The governor as chair, the chief financial officer, 107 the attorney general, <u>the commissioner of the interior</u>, and the 108 commissioner of agriculture shall constitute the trustees of the 109 internal improvement trust fund and the land acquisition trust 110 fund as provided by law.

111 (h) (g) The governor as chair, the chief financial officer, 112 the attorney general, the commissioner of the interior, and the

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113 commissioner of agriculture shall constitute the agency head of 114 the Department of Law Enforcement.

Department of the Interior Fish and wildlife 115 SECTION 9. 116 conservation commission. -- There shall be a Department of the 117 Interior to be responsible for conserving and protecting the state's natural resources and scenic beauty, including fish and 118 119 wildlife, except as otherwise provided by law fish and wildlife conservation commission, composed of seven members appointed by 120 121 the governor, subject to confirmation by the senate for staggered terms of five years. The commission shall exercise the 122 123 regulatory and executive powers of the state with respect to wild animal life and fresh water aquatic life, and shall also 124 125 exercise regulatory and executive powers of the state with 126 respect to marine life, except that all license fees for taking 127 wild animal life, fresh water aquatic life, and marine life and 128 penalties for violating regulations of the commission shall be 129 prescribed by general law. The commission shall establish 130 procedures to ensure adequate due process in the exercise of its 131 regulatory and executive functions. The legislature may enact laws in aid of the commission, not inconsistent with this 132 133 section, except that there shall be no special law or general 134 law of local application pertaining to hunting or fishing. The commission's exercise of executive powers in the area of 135 136 planning, budgeting, personnel management, and purchasing shall be as provided by law. Revenue derived from license fees for the 137 138 taking of wild animal life and fresh water aquatic life shall be appropriated to the commission by the legislature for the 139 purposes of management, protection, and conservation of wild 140 Page 5 of 8

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animal life and fresh water aquatic life. Revenue derived from 141 142 license fees relating to marine life shall be appropriated by 143 the legislature for the purposes of management, protection, and 144 conservation of marine life as provided by law. The commission 145 shall not be a unit of any other state agency and shall have its 146 own staff, which includes management, research, and enforcement. 147 Unless provided by general law, the commission shall have no authority to regulate matters relating to air and water 148 149 pollution. 150 ARTICLE XII 151 SCHEDULE 152 SECTION 23. Department of the Interior Fish and wildlife conservation commission. --153 154 (a) The initial members of the commission shall be the 155 members of the game and fresh water fish commission and the 156 marine fisheries commission who are serving on those commissions 157 on the effective date of this amendment, who may serve the 158 remainder of their respective terms. New appointments to the 159 commission shall not be made until the retirement, resignation, 160 removal, or expiration of the terms of the initial members 161 results in fewer than seven members remaining. 162 (b) The jurisdiction of the marine fisheries commission as 163 set forth in statutes in effect on March 1, 1998, shall be transferred to the fish and wildlife conservation commission. 164 The jurisdiction of the marine fisheries commission transferred 165 166 to the commission shall not be expanded except as provided by general law. All rules of the marine fisheries commission and 167 game and fresh water fish commission in effect on the effective 168 Page 6 of 8

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169 date of this amendment shall become rules of the fish and 170 wildlife conservation commission until superseded or amended by 171 the commission. 172 (c) The creation of the Department of the Interior 173 pursuant to the amendment to Section 9 of Article IV shall take 174 effect July 1, 2009, and on that the effective date of this 175 amendment, the constitutional mandate for a fish and wildlife 176 conservation marine fisheries commission and game and fresh water fish commission shall be removed abolished. 177 178 (d) This amendment shall take effect July 1, 1999. 179 SECTION 26. Commissioner of the Interior .-- The amendment to Section 4 of Article IV to create the Cabinet office of 180 commissioner of the interior shall take effect January 6, 2009, 181 182 with the office to be initially filled for a 2-year term at the 183 2008 general election. 184 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE III, SECTION 11 185 186 ARTICLE IV, SECTIONS 4 AND 9 187 ARTICLE XII, SECTIONS 23 AND 26 CONSERVATION AND PROTECTION OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND SCENIC 188 189 BEAUTY, INCLUDING FISH AND WILDLIFE. -- Proposing amendment of the 190 State Constitution to create a Department of the Interior to be responsible for conserving and protecting the state's natural 191 resources and scenic beauty, including fish and wildlife, except 192 as otherwise provided by law; to create the office of 193 Commissioner of the Interior, a Cabinet office filled by 194 statewide election, to have supervision of matters pertaining to 195 the state's natural resources and scenic beauty, including fish 196 Page 7 of 8

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197 and wildlife, except as otherwise provided by law, and to serve with the Governor and other Cabinet officers as the State Board 198 of Administration, as Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust 199 200 Fund and the Land Acquisition Trust Fund, and as the agency head 201 of the Department of Law Enforcement; to remove the 202 constitutional mandate for a Fish and Wildlife Conservation 203 Commission charged with overseeing matters relating to fish and 204 wildlife; to preserve the prohibition against any special law or 205 general law of local application relating to hunting or fishing; and to provide an effective date of July 1, 2009, for the 206 207 creation of the Department of the Interior and an effective date of January 6, 2009, for the creation of the Cabinet office of 208 Commissioner of the Interior, with the office to be filled at 209 210 the 2008 general election to an initial term of 2 years, with subsequent 4-year terms. 211

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
