 2 An act relating to sexual offenses; amending s. 810.14,
 3 F.S.; revising the elements of the offense of voyeurism in
 4 order to eliminate acts of photographing, filming,
 5 videotaping, or recording, which are elements of the
 6 separate offense of video voyeurism; providing that a
 7 person commits the offense of voyeurism when he or she,
 8 with certain intent, secretly observes another person when
 9 the other person is in a location that provides a
 10 reasonable expectation of privacy; providing an effective
 11 date.

 13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 15 Section 1. Section 810.14, Florida Statutes, is amended to
 16 read:

17 810.14 Voyeurism prohibited; penalties.--

18 (1) A person commits the offense of voyeurism when he or
 19 she, with lewd, lascivious, or indecent intent, secretly
 20 observes, ~~photographs, films, videotapes, or records~~ another
 21 person when the ~~such~~ other person is located in a dwelling,
 22 structure, or conveyance and such location provides a reasonable
 23 expectation of privacy.

24 (2) A person who violates this section commits a
 25 misdemeanor of the first degree for the first violation,
 26 punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

27 (3) A person who violates this section and who has been
 28 previously convicted or adjudicated delinquent two or more times

29 | of any violation of this section commits a felony of the third
30 | degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s.
31 | 775.084.

32 | (4) For purposes of this section, a person has been
33 | previously convicted or adjudicated delinquent of a violation of
34 | this section if the violation resulted in a conviction sentenced
35 | separately, or an adjudication of delinquency entered
36 | separately, prior to the current offense.

37 | Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
