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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to water management districts; amending s. 2 3 373.503, F.S.; providing that a water management district's millage rate is subject to annual authorization 4 by the Legislature; requiring the Legislature to annually 5 review a district's millage rate; requiring the 6 7 Legislature to annually set the amount of revenue authorized to be raised by a district from ad valorem 8 taxes; providing for the amount of authorized revenue to 9 be raised by a district if the Legislature does not set 10 the amount by a specified date; amending s. 373.536, F.S.; 11 revising the beginning and ending dates of a district's 12 fiscal year; revising the date by which a district must 13 submit a tentative budget to the Governor and the 14 Legislature; eliminating the authorization for the 15 16 Legislature to comment on such budgets; eliminating the requirement for districts to respond to such comments and 17 to forward such responses to the Governor and Legislature; 18 19 revising the date by which the Executive Office of the Governor must file a specified report with the 20 Legislature; directing districts to implement conforming 21 measures; providing an effective date. 22 23 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 24 25 26 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section

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373.503, Florida Statutes, is amended, subsection (5) is

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28 renumbered as subsection (6), and a new subsection (5) is added 29 to that section, to read:

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373.503 Manner of taxation.--

Subject to annual authorization by the Legislature 31 (3) (a) to levy ad valorem taxes under subsection (5), the districts may 32 levy ad valorem taxes on property within the district solely for 33 34 the purposes of this chapter and of chapter 25270, 1949, Laws of Florida, as amended, and chapter 61-691, Laws of Florida, as 35 36 amended. The authority to levy ad valorem taxes as provided in this act shall commence with the year 1977. However, the taxes 37 levied for 1977 by the governing boards pursuant to this section 38 shall be prorated to ensure that no such taxes will be levied 39 for the first 4 days of the tax year, which days will fall prior 40 to the effective date of the amendment to s. 9(b), Art. VII of 41 42 the State Constitution, which was approved March 9, 1976. When 43 appropriate, taxes levied by each governing board may be separated by the governing board into a millage necessary for 44 the purposes of the district and a millage necessary for 45 46 financing basin functions specified in s. 373.0695. Beginning 47 with the taxing year 1977, and Notwithstanding the provisions of any other general or special law to the contrary and subject to 48 49 annual authorization by the Legislature to levy ad valorem taxes under subsection (5), the maximum total millage rate for 50 51 district and basin purposes shall be: 52 1. Northwest Florida Water Management District: 0.05 mill.

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4. Southwest Florida Water Management District: 1.0 mill.

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Suwannee River Water Management District: 0.75 mill. St. Johns River Water Management District: 0.6 mill.

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56 South Florida Water Management District: 0.80 mill. 5. 57 (5) To ensure that the taxes authorized by this chapter continue to be in proportion to the benefits derived by the 58 several parcels of real estate within the districts, the 59 60 Legislature shall annually review the authorized millage rate for each district and annually set the amount of revenue 61 62 authorized to be raised by each district from the taxes authorized by this chapter. However, if the annual amount of 63 64 revenue authorized to be raised by each district is not set by 65 the Legislature on or before July 1 of each year, each district 66 is authorized to raise the amount of revenue authorized by the Legislature in the preceding fiscal year and adjusted by the 67 percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for the preceding 68 69 fiscal year. 70 Section 2. Subsections (1) and (2) and paragraphs (c), 71 (e), and (f) of subsection (5) of section 373.536, Florida 72 Statutes, are amended to read: 373.536 District budget and hearing thereon .--73 74 (1)FISCAL YEAR.--The fiscal year of districts created under the provisions of this chapter shall extend from July 75 76 October 1 of one year through June September 30 of the following 77 year. 78 (2)BUDGET SUBMITTAL. -- The budget officer of the district 79 shall, on or before July 15 of each year, submit for consideration by the governing board of the district a tentative 80 budget for the district covering its proposed operations and 81 82 funding requirements for the ensuing fiscal year.

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83 (5) TENTATIVE BUDGET CONTENTS AND SUBMISSION; REVIEW AND 84 APPROVAL.--

Each water management district shall, by February 85 (C) 86 August 1 of each year, submit for review a tentative budget to 87 the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the chairs of all legislative 88 89 committees and subcommittees with substantive or fiscal 90 jurisdiction over water management districts, as determined by 91 the President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of 92 Representatives as applicable, the secretary of the department, and the governing body of each county in which the district has 93 jurisdiction or derives any funds for the operations of the 94 district. 95

(e) By September 5 of the year in which the budget is 96 97 submitted, the House and Senate appropriations chairs may 98 transmit to each district comments and objections to the proposed budgets. Each district governing board shall include a 99 100 response to such comments and objections in the record of the 101 governing board meeting where final adoption of the budget takes 102 place, and the record of this meeting shall be transmitted to 103 the Executive Office of the Governor, the department, and the 104 chairs of the House and Senate appropriations committees.

105 <u>(e) (f)</u> The Executive Office of the Governor shall 106 annually, on or before <u>September</u> December 15, file with the 107 Legislature a report that summarizes its review of the water 108 management districts' tentative budgets and displays the adopted 109 budget allocations by program area. The report must identify the 110 districts that are not in compliance with the reporting

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111 requirements of this section. State funds shall be withheld from 112 a water management district that fails to comply with these 113 reporting requirements. Section 3. For the 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 fiscal years, 114 115 notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the water management 116 districts are directed to budget and plan for their fiscal management to conform to the provisions of this act. 117 118 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.

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
