Subsection (15) of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 15 Definitions.--The following words and phrases as 121.021 16 17 used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 18 Until October 1, 1978, "special risk member" means 19 (15) (a) any officer or employee whose application is approved by the 20 administrator and who receives salary payments for work 21 performed as a peace officer; law enforcement officer; police 22 23 officer; highway patrol officer; custodial employee at a Page 1 of 8

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correctional or detention facility; correctional agency employee whose duties and responsibilities involve direct contact with inmates, but excluding secretarial and clerical employees; firefighter; or an employee in any other job in the field of law enforcement or fire protection if the duties of such person are certified as hazardous by his or her employer.

31 a member of the Florida Retirement System who is designated as a

33 121.0515. Such member must be employed as a law enforcement

includes any professional health care bargaining unit or nonunit member who is employed by the Department of Corrections or
the Department of Children and Family Services and meets the

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(e) Effective July 1, 2001, the term "special risk member"
includes any member who is employed as a youth custody officer
by the Department of Juvenile Justice and meets the special
criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(g).

(f) Effective October 1, 2006, the term "special risk member" includes any member who is employed by a county or a sheriff to work as a registered nurse, a licensed practical nurse, or an advanced registered nurse practitioner exclusively in a county detention facility as defined in s. 951.23(1)(a) and who meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(i).

In addition, the member's duties 86 87 and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct 88 89 supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or 90 firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the Division 91 92 of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer 93 Services; or the member must be the supervisor or command 94 officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, 95 96 but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 97 98 personnel, shall not be included and further provided that all periods of creditable service in fire prevention or firefighter 99 100 training, or as the supervisor or command officer of a member or 101 members who have such responsibilities, and for which the 102 employer paid the special risk contribution rate, shall be 103 included;

104 (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer 105 and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance 106 with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and 107 responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint Page 4 of 8

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108 when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, 109 or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member 110 must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members 111 who have such responsibilities; provided, however, 112 113 administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in 114 accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 115 116 included; however, wardens and assistant wardens, as defined by 117 rule, shall participate in the Special Risk Class;

(i) The member must be employed by a county or a sheriff to work exclusively in a county detention facility, as defined in s. 951.23(1)(a), as a registered nurse, a licensed practical nurse, or an advanced registered nurse practitioner, as defined in s. 464.003(4)-(6), and must spend at least 75 percent of his or her time performing nursing acts, as described in s. 464.003(3), which involve contact with inmates.

207 Section 3. The Legislature finds that a proper and 208 legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees 209 of the state and its political subdivisions and the dependents, 210 survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and retirees are extended the basic protections afforded by governmental 211 retirement systems. These persons must be provided benefits that 212 213 are fair and adequate and that are managed, administered, and funded in a sound actuarial manner, as required by section 14, 214 215 Article X of the State Constitution and part VII of chapter 112, 216 Florida Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature hereby determines 217 and declares that this act fulfills an important state interest. 218 Section 4. This act shall take effect October 1, 2006.

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
