20	Section 1. Subsections (2), (7), (25), (27), and (28)
21	of section 489.505, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

23	(2) "Alarm system contractor" means a person whose
24	business includes the execution of contracts requiring the
25	ability, experience, science, knowledge, and skill to lay out,
26	fabricate, install, maintain, alter, repair, monitor, inspect,
27	replace, or service alarm systems for compensation, including,
28	but not limited to, all types of alarm systems for all
29	purposes. <u>This term also means any person, firm, or</u>
30	corporation that engages in the business of alarm contracting
31	under an expressed or implied contract; that undertakes,

1 offers to undertake, purports to have the capacity to 2 undertake, or submits a bid to engage in the business of alarm contracting; or that by itself or by or through others engages 3 in the business of alarm contracting. 4 "Alarm system contractor I" means an alarm system 5 (a) б contractor whose business includes all types of alarm systems 7 for all purposes. 8 (b) "Alarm system contractor II" means an alarm system 9 contractor whose business includes all types of alarm systems other than fire, for all purposes, except as herein provided. 10 (7) "Certified alarm system contractor" means an alarm 11 12 system contractor who possesses a certificate of competency 13 issued by the department. The scope of certification is limited to alarm circuits originating in the alarm control 14 panel and equipment governed by the applicable provisions of 15 Articles 725, 760, 770, 800, and 810 of the National 16 17 Electrical Code, Current Edition, and National Fire Protection 18 Association Standard 72, Current Edition. The scope of certification for alarm system contractors also includes the 19 installation, repair, fabrication, erection, alteration, 20 21 addition, inspection, monitoring, or design of electrical 22 wiring, fixtures, appliances, thermostats, apparatus, 23 raceways, and conduit, or any part thereof not to exceed 98 volts (RMS) 77 volts, when those items are for the purpose of 2.4 transmitting data or proprietary video (satellite systems that 25 26 are not part of a community antenna television or radio 27 distribution system) or providing central vacuum capability or 2.8 electric locks; however, this provision governing the scope of 29 certification does not create any mandatory licensure 30 requirement. (25) "Burglar alarm system agent" means a person: 31

(27) "Monitoring" means to receive electrical or 11 12 electronic signals, originating from any structure building 13 within the state or outside the state, regardless of whether those signals are relayed through a jurisdiction outside the 14 state, where such signals are, produced by any security, 15 medical, fire, or burglar alarm, closed circuit television 16 17 camera, access-control system, or related or similar protective system and are intended by design to initiate a 18 response thereto. 12	residential or commercial intrusion/burglary alarms that have
13	central monitoring must have a central monitoring verification
14	call made to the premises generating the alarm signal, prior
15	to alarm monitor personnel contacting a law enforcement agency
16	for alarm dispatch. The central monitoring station must employ
17	call-verification methods for the premises generating the
18	<u>alarm signal if the first call is not answered.</u> However, if
19	the intrusion/burglary alarms have properly operating visual
20	or auditory sensors that enable the monitoring personnel to
21	verify the alarm signal, verification calling is not required.

Requires a central monitoring station to employ call-verification methods under certain circumstances. Exempts a fire alarm system from the requirement that it have a device that automatically terminates its audible alarm signal after a certain amount of time.
