(1) As used in this section, the term "certified psychology specialist," "board-certified psychology specialist," or "psychology diplomate" means a psychologist with special competency that is acquired through an organized sequence of formal education, training, experience, and professional standing and is recognized by a certifying body approved under subsection (3).

- (2) A person licensed as a psychologist may not hold himself or herself out as a certified psychology specialist, board-certified psychology specialist, or psychology diplomate unless the person has received formal recognition as a certified psychology specialist, board-certified psychology specialist, or psychology diplomate from a certifying body approved under subsection (3).
- (3) (a) The board shall be responsible for approving the certifying bodies that recognize certified psychology specialists, board-certified psychology specialists, or psychology diplomates. The certifying body shall require, as a condition of recognition, the following criteria in order to be approved by the board:
 - 1. A minimum of 3 years of experience as a psychologist.
 - 2. Peer review of applicants.

- 3. Additional education which may include self-study.
- 4. Adherence to standards established by the certifying body.
- (b) The board shall adopt, by rule under ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54, an application and a process for the approval of certifying bodies.
