HB 793 2006

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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the City of Orlando, Orange County; providing legislative findings; creating a pilot program; authorizing the City of Orlando to adopt an ordinance establishing a local exemption to certain provisions of general law and agency rules relating to public food service establishments in order to permit patrons' dogs at certain designated outdoor portions of public food service establishments; providing for implementation and enforcement procedures; providing for future review and repeal; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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- Section 1. Public food service establishment requirements; local exemption for dogs in designated outdoor portions; findings and intent; pilot program. -- The Legislature finds and declares the following:
 - This act shall apply only to the City of Orlando. (1)
- Chapter 509, Florida Statutes, requires that the (2) Division of Hotels and Restaurants of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation carry out all laws and rules relating to the inspection and regulation of public food service establishments for the purpose of safeguarding the public health, safety, and welfare.
- Section 509.013(5), Florida Statutes, defines a public food service establishment as "any building, vehicle, place, or structure, or any room or division of a building, vehicle,

place, or structure, or any room or division in a building, vehicle, place, or structure where food is prepared, served, or sold for immediate consumption on or in the vicinity of the premises; called for or taken out by customers; or prepared prior to being delivered to another location for consumption."

- (4) Section 509.032, Florida Statutes, requires that the Division of Hotels and Restaurants adopt and enforce such rules as are necessary to ensure the protection of the public from food-borne illness in public food service establishments.
- that the Division of Hotels and Restaurants adopt such rules in order to "provide the standards and requirements for obtaining, storing, preparing, processing, serving, or displaying food in public food service establishments, approving the public food service establishment facility plans, conducting necessary public food service establishment inspections for compliance with sanitation regulations, cooperating and coordinating with the Department of Health in epidemiological investigations, and initiating enforcement actions, and for other such responsibilities deemed necessary by the division."
- (6) Pursuant to the grant of rulemaking authority cited in subsection (5), the Division of Hotels and Restaurants has adopted chapter 61C-4, Florida Administrative Code, concerning public food service establishments.
- (7) Section 61C-4.010, Florida Administrative Code, concerning the sanitation and safety requirements of public food service establishments, includes section 61C-4.010(6), relating to physical facilities, which adopts by reference chapter 6 of

the 2001 FDA Food Code as developed by the Food and Drug

Administration of the United States Department of Health and

Human Services.

- (8) Section 6-501.115, 2001 FDA Food Code, generally prohibits live animals from public food service establishments.
- (9) Section 509.032(7), Florida Statutes, expressly preempts to the state regulation of public lodging establishments and public food service establishments for compliance with the sanitation standards adopted by the division.
- (10) Section 509.032(7), Florida Statutes, expressly
 limits the general home rule powers of local governments as it
 relates to the regulation of public food service establishments.
- (11) The purpose of this act is to allow the City of Orlando to enact an ordinance establishing procedures by which public food service establishments could exempt their establishments from section 6-501.115, 2001 FDA Food Code, and allow patrons' dogs within certain designated outdoor portions of their respective establishments.
- (12) It is therefore the intent of the Legislature by this act to establish a 3-year pilot program in the City of Orlando to allow patrons' dogs within certain designated outdoor portions of participating public food service establishments.
- Section 2. Local exemption authorized.--The governing board of the City of Orlando is authorized to establish, by ordinance, a local exemption procedure to section 6-501.115, 2001 FDA Food Code, as adopted and incorporated by the Division

of Hotels and Restaurants at chapter 61C-4.010(6), Florida Administrative Code.

Section 3. Local discretion; codification. --

- (1) The adoption of the local exemption procedure shall be at the sole discretion of the governing board of the City of Orlando. Nothing in this act shall be construed to require or compel the governing board of the City of Orlando to adopt an ordinance pursuant to this act.
- (2) Any ordinance adopted pursuant to this act shall provide for codification within the land development code of the City of Orlando.
- Section 4. <u>Limitations on exemption; permit</u> requirements.--
- (1) Any local exemption procedure adopted pursuant to this act shall only provide a variance to section 6-501.115, 2001 FDA Food Code, to allow patrons' dogs within certain designated outdoor portions of public food service establishments.
- welfare of the public, the local exemption procedure shall require participating public food service establishments to apply for and receive a permit from the City of Orlando before allowing patrons' dogs on their premises. The city shall require such information from the applicant as the city deems reasonably necessary to enforce the provisions of this act, but shall require, at a minimum, the following information:
- (a) Name, location, and mailing address of the public food service establishment.

(b) Name, mailing address, and telephone contact information of the permit applicant.

- (c) A diagram and description of the outdoor area to be designated as available to patrons' dogs, including dimensions of the designated area; a depiction of the number and placement of tables, chairs, and restaurant equipment, if any; the entryways and exits to the designated outdoor area; the boundaries of the designated area and of other areas of outdoor dining not available for patrons' dogs; any fences or other barriers; surrounding property lines and public rights-of-way, including sidewalks and common pathways; and such other information reasonably required by the permitting authority. The diagram or plan shall be accurate and to scale but need not be prepared by a licensed design professional.
- (d) A description of the days of the week and hours of operation that patrons' dogs will be permitted in the designated outdoor area.
- (3) In order to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of the public, the local exemption ordinance shall include such regulations and limitations as deemed necessary by the City of Orlando and shall include, but not be limited to, the following requirements:
- (a) All public food service establishment employees shall wash their hands promptly after touching, petting, or otherwise handling dogs. Employees shall be prohibited from touching, petting, or otherwise handling dogs while serving food or beverages or handling tableware or before entering other parts of the food service establishment.

(b) Patrons in a designated outdoor area shall be advised that they should wash their hands before eating. Waterless hand sanitizer shall be provided at all tables in the designated outdoor area.

- (c) Employees and patrons shall be instructed that they shall not allow dogs to come into contact with serving dishes, utensils, tableware, linens, paper products, or any other items involved with food service operations.
- (d) Patrons shall keep their dogs on a leash at all times and shall keep their dogs under reasonable control.
- (e) Dogs shall not be allowed on chairs, tables, or other furnishings.
- (f) All table and chair surfaces shall be cleaned and sanitized with an approved product between seatings of patrons.

 Spilled food and drink shall be removed from the floor or ground between seatings of patrons.
- (g) Accidents involving dog waste shall be cleaned immediately and the area sanitized with an approved product. A kit with the appropriate materials for this purpose shall be kept near the designated outdoor area.
- (h) A sign or signs reminding employees of the applicable rules shall be posted on premises in a manner and place as determined by the local permitting authority.
- (i) A sign or signs reminding patrons of the applicable rules shall be posted on premises in a manner and place as determined by the local permitting authority.
- (j) A sign or signs shall be posted in a manner and place as determined by the local permitting authority that places the

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- Section 5. <u>Powers; enforcement.--The City of Orlando shall</u>
 have such powers as are reasonably necessary to regulate and enforce the provisions of this act.
- Section 6. <u>State assistance.--The Division of Hotels and Restaurants shall provide reasonable assistance to the City of Orlando in the development of enforcement procedures and regulations.</u>
- Section 7. This act shall expire July 1, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- Section 8. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
