Commits the act of strangulation by knowingly or 20 intentionally impeding the normal breathing or circulation of the blood of the other person by applying pressure on the throat 21 or neck or by blocking the nose or mouth of the other person. It 22 is an affirmative defense to a charge under this subparagraph 23 that an act constituting strangulation was the result of a 24 25 legitimate medical procedure. A person who commits felony battery commits a felony 26 (2)27 of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. 28
