The department may issue a certificate by endorsement 125 (2) 126 to practice radiologic technology to an applicant who, upon applying to the department and remitting a nonrefundable fee not 127 128 to exceed \$50, demonstrates to the department that he or she 129 holds a current certificate, license, or registration to practice radiologic technology, provided that the requirements 130 for such certificate, license, or registration are deemed by the 131 132 department to be substantially equivalent to those established 133 under this part and rules adopted under this part.
