- Section 1. Verification of identity for public benefits, licenses, permits, and voter registration. --
- A department, agency, commission, or other entity of the state, a political subdivision, or an officer or employee thereof may not recognize or rely upon, or authorize the recognition of or reliance upon, any document that is not described in subsection (3) when the document is offered to prove the identity of a person applying for a public benefit, license, or permit.
- (2) Notwithstanding part II of chapter 97, Florida Statutes, a department or other entity of the state, a political subdivision, or any agency or employee thereof authorized to register a person to vote in any federal, state, or local election may not recognize or rely upon, or authorize the recognition of or reliance upon, any document that is not

described in subsection (3) when the document is offered to prove the identity of a person attempting to register to vote in this state.

- (3) Documents acceptable to prove the identity of a person are limited to:
- (a) A valid, unexpired passport issued by the United States, an immigration document issued by the Federal Government, and any document issued by an agency of the Federal Government or the Armed Services of the United States which bears a photograph of the person.
- (b) A valid, unexpired passport issued by a foreign government if the passport includes or is accompanied by a document proving that the alien is lawfully in the United States.
- (c) A valid, unexpired identification document issued by a state or political subdivision if the document bears a recent photograph of the individual, the issuing state or political subdivision prohibits the issuance of the identification document to an alien who is unlawfully in the United States, and the state or political subdivision requires independent verification of the records offered by the person to prove identity when applying for the identification document.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
