1 2 A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 5 of Article VI of the State Constitution to prescribe 3 4 additional circumstances in which electors may vote in a primary election regardless of party affiliation. 5 6 7 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 8 That the following amendment to Section 5 of Article VI of 9 the State Constitution is agreed to and shall be submitted to 10 11 the electors of this state for approval or rejection at the next 12 general election or at an earlier special election specifically 13 authorized by law for that purpose: ARTICLE VI 14 SUFFRAGE AND ELECTIONS 15 Primary, general, and special elections .--16 SECTION 5. A general election shall be held in each county on the 17 (a) first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-18 19 numbered year to choose a successor to each elective state and 20 county officer whose term will expire before the next general election and, except as provided herein, to fill each vacancy in 21 elective office for the unexpired portion of the term. A general 22 election may be suspended or delayed due to a state of emergency 23 or impending emergency pursuant to general law. Special 24 elections and referenda shall be held as provided by law. 25 If all candidates for an office have the same party 26 (b) 27 affiliation and the winner will have either no opposition in the general election or opposition only from a write-in candidate, 28

29 <u>then</u> all qualified electors, regardless of party affiliation,
30 may vote in the primary elections for that office.

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following statement be 32 placed on the ballot:

33 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE VI, SECTION 5 34 OPEN PRIMARY ELECTION; ADDITIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES. -- Proposing 35 36 an amendment to the State Constitution that will permit all electors regardless of party affiliation to vote in any primary 37 election for an office, in the same manner as currently 38 39 permitted when the winner of the primary will be unopposed in 40 the general election, if the winner of the primary will be 41 opposed in the general election by a write-in candidate only.
