In addition, the member's primary duties and 20 responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, 21 control, investigation, apprehension, arrest, and counseling of 22 assigned juveniles within the community; or 23 24 (h) The member must be employed by a law enforcement 25 agency or medical examiner's office in a forensic discipline 26 recognized by the International Association for Identification 27 and must qualify for active membership in the International Association for Identification. 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29 responsibilities must include the collection, examination, 30 preservation, documentation, preparation, or analysis of physical evidence or testimony, or both, or the member must be 31 32 the direct supervisor, quality management supervisor, or command 33 officer of one or more individuals with such responsibility. Administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, 34 35 those whose primary responsibilities are clerical or in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 36 37 included; or 38 (i) The member must be employed by a county, municipality, 39 or district law enforcement or fire services agency as an emergency dispatcher. The member's primary duties and 40 41 responsibilities must include reception of emergency calls for service; coordination of the direction and placement of field 42 units to strategic locations for critical incidents; 43 prioritization of calls for service; selection of assignments 44 45 and dispatch of emergency and nonemergency calls via radio 46 communication technology to county, municipal, intercounty, and 47 federal personnel using the assigned talk groups; monitoring of the safety status of all field units; and coordination of the 48 movements of multiple emergency units engaged in pursuit tactics 49 or responding to life or death situations, or the member must be 50 the direct supervisor or command officer of one or more 51 52 individuals with such responsibilities. 53 Section 2. The Legislature finds that a proper and 54 legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees 55 of the state and its political subdivisions, and the dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and retirees, are 56
