House Resolution

A resolution honoring the late Copeland D. Newbern, Jr.

WHEREAS, Copeland D. Newbern, Jr., familiarly known as "Cope," a North Carolinian by birth but a Floridian by choice, was awarded a Bachelor of Science degree in Agriculture by the University of Florida in 1933 and was later honored as a recipient of the university's Distinguished Alumni Award, and

WHEREAS, until his death on October 29, 2005, Mr. Newbern maintained strong ties to his alma mater, as evidenced by his service as a member of the University of Florida Foundation Board and the UF/IFAS Share Council and by the establishment, with his wife, Edna, of a \$1 million endowment for agricultural scholarships, and

WHEREAS, after receiving his degree, Mr. Newbern taught at Hernando High School; thereafter served as the agricultural agent for that county; and, in 1945, moved to Tampa, where he demonstrated his entrepreneurial expertise in the citrus gift business, an enterprise eventually expanded to include citrus groves in five counties, including the landmark "Newbern Groves," a 40-acre tract of citrus in Hillsborough County along North Nebraska Avenue, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Newbern was a valued member of the boards of the Florida Citrus Commission, the Florida Fresh Fruit Shippers, and the United Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Association and was inducted into the Florida Agricultural Hall of Fame in 1999, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Newbern also served on many other boards, including his service as Chairman of the Federal Reserve Bank of

Atlanta, Jacksonville Branch; as Curator for Stephens College in Columbia, Missouri, where he was elected Honorary Life Member of the Board of Curators in 1982; and as a trustee for the Florida Institute of Technology, NOW, THEREFORE,
