House Resolution

A resolution designating March 29, 2006, as "F.S.U. Day" in Tallahassee.

WHEREAS, the Tallahassee campus of Florida State University is the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida and holds the state's first chapter of Phi Beta Kappa, which was chartered in 1935, and

WHEREAS, in 1994, the Florida State University joined an elite group of the nation's top research universities when it was designated as a "Research I" institution by the Carnegie Foundation, and

WHEREAS, today, Florida State University offers graduate and undergraduate degrees in 304 programs within 17 independent colleges and schools, taught by a 1,897-member faculty that has included 10 National Academy of Sciences members and 6 Nobel Laureates, and

WHEREAS, Florida State University houses the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory, which uses the world's most powerful magnet to conduct research into the frontiers of science and engineering technologies for a new century, and

WHEREAS, Florida State University has graduated its second Rhodes Scholar, Garrett Johnson, who was one of only 32 students in the United States to receive this distinguished award, and

WHEREAS, the fully accredited Florida State University

College of Medicine, the first new doctor of medicine program to
be established in the United States since 1982, recently

graduated its inaugural class and currently has 223 medical students and 5 doctor of philosophy students enrolled, and

WHEREAS, the college experience continues to enrich the lives of Florida State University students because of the long-standing tradition of promoting racial, ethnic, and cultural diversity on its campus along with the aggressive recruitment of diverse groups of students, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the House of Representatives designates March 29, 2006, as "F.S.U. Day" in Tallahassee in recognition of the university's contributions as an outstanding institution of higher education.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be presented to Dr. T. K. Wetherell, President of Florida State University, as a tangible token of the sentiments expressed herein.
