House Resolution

A resolution recognizing the month of April 2006 as "Cancer Control Awareness Month" in Florida.

5 WHEREAS, during the course of a lifetime, cancer, the 6 leading cause of death, will strike approximately one out of two 7 men and one out of three women, accounting for one of every four 8 deaths, but it has been determined that many cancers can be 9 cured if detected early and treated promptly or can be prevented 10 by lifestyle changes, and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that, during 2006, more than 98,960 new cases of cancer will be diagnosed in Florida alone and more than 39,930 Floridians will die from the disease, and

WHEREAS, 87 percent of all lung cancer deaths and 29 percent of all cancer deaths are attributable to cigarette smoking or other tobacco use, and as many as one-third of such deaths expected during this year may be associated with poor nutrition, physical inactivity, obesity, and other lifestyle factors and thus may have been prevented, and

21 WHEREAS, the 5-year survival rate for all cancers combined 22 is 65 percent, but survival rates may increase significantly for 23 certain cancers such as breast, cervical, and colorectal cancers 24 if they are detected and treated early, and cancer incidence and 25 death in Florida may be significantly reduced with increased 26 awareness of and adherence to the American Cancer Society's 27 cancer screening guidelines, and
