The Committee on Judiciary (Posey) recommended the following amendment:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

On page 1, line 23, through page 2, line 16, delete those lines

and insert:

(1) Each county in which a drug court program has been established under s. 397.334 may require by ordinance the assessment of a mandatory cost in the sum of \$6 which shall be assessed by both the circuit court and the county court in the county against every person:

(a) who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to, or is convicted of, regardless of adjudication, a violation of chapter 893,

(b) who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to, or is convicted of, regardless of adjudication, a violation of a municipal ordinance or a county ordinance, involving the use of alcohol or other substance use or abuse, or

(c) who pays a fine or civil penalty for any violation

4 The \$6 assessment shall be in addition to any fine, civil
5 penalty, or other court cost and may not be deducted from the
6 proceeds of that portion of any fine or civil penalty which is

8 accordance with ss. 316.660 and 318.21. The \$6 assessment
9 shall specifically be added to any civil penalty paid for a
10 violation of chapter 316, whether such penalty is paid by
11 mail, paid in person without request for a hearing, or paid
12 after a hearing and determination by the court.
