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2006 A bill to be entitled An act relating to instructional materials for public school education; amending s. 1006.28, F.S.; requiring district school boards to issue additional textbooks for use in the classroom in grades 6 through 8; providing an effective date. WHEREAS, because of the elimination of lockers in many middle schools, students must carry their issued textbooks throughout the school day, and WHEREAS, carrying such books has the potential to lead to minor to severe back problems, NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section Section 1. 1006.28, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 1006.28 Duties of district school board, district school superintendent; and school principal regarding K-12 instructional materials.--DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD. -- The district school board has (1)the duty to provide adequate instructional materials for all students in accordance with the requirements of this part. The term "adequate instructional materials" means a sufficient number of textbooks or sets of materials serving as the basis for instruction for each student in the core courses of mathematics, language arts, social studies, science, reading, and literature, except for instruction for which the school

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advisory council approves the use of a program that does not include a textbook as a major tool of instruction. The district school board has the following specific duties:

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(b) Textbooks.--

Provide for proper requisitioning, distribution, 33 1. accounting, storage, care, and use of all instructional 34 35 materials furnished by the state and furnish such other instructional materials as may be needed. The district school 36 37 board shall assure that instructional materials used in the 38 district are consistent with the district goals and objectives and the curriculum frameworks adopted by rule of the State Board 39 of Education, as well as with the state and district performance 40 41 standards provided for in s. 1001.03(1).

42 <u>2. Issue additional textbooks to remain in each classroom</u>
43 <u>for use in the classroom by each student in grades 6 through 8</u>
44 <u>who participates in the class. The issuance of textbooks</u>
45 <u>pursuant to this subparagraph shall not affect the issuance of</u>
46 <u>textbooks to each student.</u>

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.

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
