2 An act relating to Broward County; creating the Broward County Council for Services for Seniors; creating an 3 4 independent special district to provide funding for 5 services for seniors; requiring approval by a majority vote of electors to annually levy ad valorem taxes not to 6 7 exceed a certain maximum; creating a governing board for the district; specifying criteria for membership of the 8 9 governing board; providing terms of office; specifying the 10 powers and functions of the council; requiring the council 11 to elect a chair, vice chair, and officers, to identify and assess the needs of seniors, to provide training and 12 orientation to new members of the council, to make and 13 adopt bylaws and rules for the council's operation and 14 governance, and to provide an annual report to the Broward 15 County Board of County Commissioners; requiring the 16 17 council to maintain minutes of each meeting and to serve 18 without compensation; requiring the council to prepare a 19 tentative annual budget and to compute a millage rate to fund the tentative budget; requiring that all tax moneys 20 collected be paid directly to the council by the Broward 21 County Tax Collector and deposited in gualified public 22 depositories; specifying expenditures of funds; requiring 23 24 the council to prepare and file a financial report to the Broward County Board of County Commissioners; providing 25 that the district may be amended or dissolved by a special 26 27 act of the Legislature; authorizing the Broward County Board of County Commissioners to fund the budget of the 28

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29 council from its own funds after or during the council's 30 first year of operation; requiring the district to comply with statutory requirements related to the filing of a 31 32 financial or compliance report; authorizing the district to seek grants and accept donations from public and 33 private sources; providing legislative intent with respect 34 to the use of funds collected by the council; requiring a 35 referendum; providing a ballot statement; providing an 36 effective date. 37 38 WHEREAS, the Legislature has determined that it would 39 serve the public interest to establish an independent 40 special district to provide services to seniors within 41 42 Broward County, NOW, THEREFORE, 43 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 44 45 46 Section 1. Services for seniors; independent special 47 district; council; powers, duties, and functions.--There is hereby created an independent special 48 (1) 49 district, as defined in sections 189.403 and 200.001, Florida Statutes, to provide funding for services for seniors throughout 50 Broward County in accordance with this act. The boundaries of 51 52 such district shall be coterminous with the boundaries of 53 Broward County. The district created pursuant to this act shall levy and fix millage as provided in section 200.065, Florida 54 55 Statutes. Once the millage is approved by the electorate, the district is not required to seek approval of the electorate in 56

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57	future years to levy the previously approved millage. For
58	purposes of this section, the term "senior" means a person who
59	is at least 60 years of age.
60	(2) The governing board of the district shall be the
61	Broward County Council for Services for Seniors. The council
62	shall consist of 11 members, including the Executive Director of
63	the Area Agency on Aging of Broward County or his or her
64	designee who is a director of senior programs; the Broward
65	County Director of Human Services or his or her designee who is
66	a director of senior services; one member of the Broward County
67	Board of County Commissioners; two nonvoting members of the
68	Broward County Legislative Delegation appointed by the
69	delegation chair; and two representatives of the Broward League
70	of Cities appointed by the President of the League of Cities.
71	The Executive Director of the Area Agency on Aging of Broward
72	County or his or her designee and the Broward County Director of
73	Human Services or his or her designee are permanent positions.
74	The members appointed from the Broward County Board of County
75	Commissioners, the Broward County Legislative Delegation, and
76	the Broward League of Cities shall be appointed to 2-year terms
77	each. The other four members shall be appointed by the Governor
78	and shall represent, to the greatest extent possible, the
79	cultural diversity of Broward County's population. At least one
80	of the gubernatorial appointees must be an individual who is
81	both a caretaker for a senior and 60 years of age or older.
82	Recommendations for these members shall be provided by the
83	Broward County Board of County Commissioners. Three names shall
84	be submitted for each vacancy, determined by category. The
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85	gubernatorial appointees shall be appointed to 4-year terms and
86	may be reappointed for one additional term of office. The
87	Governor shall make a selection within a 45-day period or
88	request a new list of candidates. All members appointed by the
89	Governor must have been residents of Broward County for the
90	previous 24 months. The length of the terms of the initial
91	appointees shall be adjusted to stagger the terms. The Governor
92	may remove a member for cause or upon the written petition of
93	the Broward County Board of County Commissioners. If any of the
94	members of the council appointed by the Governor resign, die, or
95	are removed from office, the vacancy shall be filled by
96	appointment by the Governor using the same method as the
97	original appointment, and such appointment to fill a vacancy
98	shall be for the unexpired term of the member who resigns, dies,
99	or is removed from office.
100	(3)(a) The Broward County Council for Services for Seniors
101	may:
102	1. Provide and maintain in the county the preventive,
103	developmental, treatment, and rehabilitative services for
104	seniors the council determines are needed for the general
105	welfare of seniors.
106	2. Provide any other services the council determines are
107	needed for the general welfare of seniors in the county.
108	3. Allocate and provide funds for other agencies in the
109	county that are operated for the benefit of seniors.
110	4. Collect information and statistical data and conduct
111	research and assessments that will be helpful to the council and
112	the county in deciding the needs of seniors in the county.
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5. Consult and coordinate with other agencies dedicated to 113 the welfare of seniors to the end that the overlapping of 114 115 services will be prevented. 6. Seek grants from state, federal, and local agencies and 116 117 accept donations from public and private sources. 7. Lease or buy real estate, equipment, and personal 118 property and construct buildings as needed to execute the 119 foregoing powers and functions, except that such purchases or 120 construction may only be paid for with cash on hand or secured 121 by funds deposited in financial institutions. This subparagraph 122 123 does not authorize the district to issue bonds of any nature, and the district does not have the power to require the 124 125 imposition of any bond by the governing body of the county. 8. Employ, pay, and provide benefits for any part-time or 126 full-time personnel needed to execute the foregoing powers and 127 128 functions. 129 (b) The Broward County Council for Services for Seniors 130 shall: Immediately after the members are appointed, elect a 131 1. 132 chair and vice chair from among its members and elect other 133 officers as deemed necessary by the council. 2. As soon as possible after the members are appointed and 134 135 officers are elected, identify and assess the needs of seniors in the county and submit to the Broward County Board of County 136 137 Commissioners a written description of: a. The activities, services, and opportunities that will 138 139 be provided to seniors. The anticipated schedule for providing those 140 b.

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141 activities, services, and opportunities. 142 The manner in which seniors will be served, including a с. 143 description of arrangements and agreements that will be made with community organizations, state and local agencies, federal 144 145 agencies, public assistance agencies, the court system, guardianship groups, and other applicable public and private 146 agencies and organizations. 147 d. The special outreach efforts that will be undertaken to 148 149 provide services to at-risk, abused, or neglected and ailing 150 seniors. 151 e. The manner in which the council will seek and provide funding for unmet needs. 152 The strategy that will be used for interagency 153 f. 154 coordination to maximize existing human and fiscal resources. 155 3. Provide training and orientation to all new members 156 sufficient to allow them to perform their duties. 157 4. Make and adopt bylaws and rules for the council's guidance, operation, governance, and maintenance not 158 159 inconsistent with federal or state laws or county ordinances. 160 5. Provide an annual written report, to be presented no later than January 1, to the Broward County Board of County 161 162 Commissioners. The annual report must contain, but need not be 163 limited to: a. Information on the effectiveness of activities, 164 165 services, and programs offered by the council, including cost-166 effectiveness. b. A detailed anticipated budget for continuation of 167 168 activities, services, and programs offered by the council and a Page 6 of 11

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169 list of all sources of requested funding, both public and 170 private. 171 c. Procedures used for early identification of at-risk seniors who need additional or continued services and methods 172 173 for ensuring that the additional or continued services are 174 provided. d. A description of the degree to which the council's 175 176 objectives and activities are consistent with the goals of this 177 section. 178 e. Detailed data on the various programs, services, and 179 activities available to seniors. f. Information on programs, services, and activities that 180 should be eliminated; programs, services, and activities that 181 182 should be continued; and programs, services, and activities that 183 should be added to the basic format of the council. 184 (C) The council shall maintain minutes of each meeting, 185 including a record of all votes cast, and shall make such 186 minutes available to any interested person. 187 (d) Members of the council shall serve without 188 compensation but are entitled to receive reimbursement for per 189 diem and travel expenses consistent with section 112.061, 190 Florida Statutes. 191 (4) (a) The district shall maintain the same fiscal year as 192 Broward County. 193 (b) On or before July 1 of each year, the council shall 194 prepare a tentative annual written budget of the district's 195 expected income and expenditures, including a contingency fund. The council shall, in addition, compute a proposed millage rate 196

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197 within the voter-approved cap necessary to fund the tentative 198 budget and, prior to adopting a final budget, comply with 199 section 200.065, Florida Statutes, relating to the method of fixing millage, and fix the final millage rate by resolution of 200 201 the council. The adopted budget and final millage rate must be certified and delivered to the Broward County Board of County 202 203 Commissioners within 15 days following the council's adoption of 204 the final budget and millage rate under chapter 200, Florida 205 Statutes. Included in each certified budget shall be the millage 206 rate, adopted by resolution of the council, necessary to be 207 applied to raise the funds budgeted for district operations and 208 expenditures. District millage may not exceed 0.5 mills of 209 assessed valuation of all properties within Broward County that 210 are subject to ad valorem county taxes. 211 After the budget of the district is certified and (C) 212 delivered to the Broward County Board of County Commissioners, 213 the budget may not be changed or modified by the Broward County 214 Board of County Commissioners or any other authority. (d) 215 All taxes collected under this section, as soon after 216 collection as is reasonably practicable, shall be paid directly 217 to the council by the Broward County Revenue Collection 218 Division. 219 1. All moneys received by the council shall be deposited in qualified public depositories, as defined in section 280.02, 220 221 Florida Statutes, with separate and distinguishable accounts established specifically for the council and may be withdrawn 222 223 only by checks signed by the chair of the council and 224 countersigned by one other member of the council or by a chief

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225 executive officer authorized by the council. 2. Upon entering the duties of office, the chair and the 226 227 other member of the council or chief executive officer who signs its checks shall each file a surety bond in the sum of at least 228 229 \$1,000 for each \$1 million or portion thereof of the council's annual budget, which bond shall be conditioned upon the faithful 230 discharge of the duties of his or her office. The premium on 231 232 such bond may be paid by the district as part of the expenses of 233 the council. Other members of the council may not be required to 234 give bond or other security. 235 Funds of the district may only be expended by check, 3. 236 except expenditures from a petty cash account, which account may not at any time exceed \$100. All expenditures from petty cash 237 238 must be recorded on the books and records of the council. Funds 239 of the council, except expenditures from petty cash, may not be 240 expended without prior approval of the council, in addition to 241 the budgeting thereof. 242 (e) Within 10 days, exclusive of weekends and legal holidays, after the expiration of each quarter-annual period, 243 244 the council shall prepare and file with the Broward County Board 245 of County Commissioners a financial report that includes: 1. The total expenditures of the council for the quarter-246 247 annual period. 2. The total receipts of the council during the quarter-248 249 annual period. 250 3. A statement of the funds the council has on hand, has 251 invested, or has deposited with qualified public depositories at 252 the end of the quarter-annual period.

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253 The total administrative costs of the council for the 4. quarter-annual period. 254 255 The district created under this act may be amended or (5) 256 dissolved by a special act of the Legislature. 257 (6) After or during the first year of operation of the council, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners, at 258 259 its option, may fund in whole or in part the budget of the 260 council from its own funds. 261 (7) The district created under this act shall comply with 262 all other statutory requirements of general application that 263 relate to the filing of any financial reports or compliancy reports required under part III of chapter 218, Florida 264 265 Statutes, or any other report or documentation required by law, 266 including the requirements of sections 189.415, 189.417, and 267 189.418, Florida Statutes. 268 Section 2. Referendum.--The Broward County Board of County 269 Commissioners is directed to call and the Supervisor of 270 Elections of Broward County shall conduct a special referendum 271 election to be held in conjunction with the primary election 272 held on September 5, 2006, to carry out the purposes and intent 273 of this act and to do all things necessary to implement and fund the Broward County Council for Services for Seniors and the 274 275 independent special district created hereby in accordance with 276 the terms of this act and the laws pertaining to elections. The 277 item shall appear on the ballot as follows: 278 279 Creating the Council for Services for Seniors and authorization 280 of taxation

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281 282 An independent special district known as the "Broward County 283 Council for Services for Seniors" is created to fund the improvement and availability of services for seniors by levying 284 285 each year an ad valorem tax not to exceed 0.5 mills for services 286 for seniors. 287 288 Yes 289 No 290 291 Section 3. This act shall take effect only upon approval by a majority vote of those qualified electors of Broward County 292 293 voting in a referendum election to be called by the Broward County Board of County Commissioners and held in conjunction 294 295 with the primary election held on September 5, 2006, in 296 accordance with the provisions of law relating to elections 297 currently in force, except that this section and section 2 298 shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
