The bill includes legislative adoption, by reference to a document filed with the Secretary of the Senate, titled “Public School Funding – The Florida Education Finance Program” for the purpose of displaying the calculations used by the Legislature, consistent with requirements of Florida Statutes, in making appropriations for the Florida Education Finance Program.
