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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Medical Care Advisory Committee; creating s. 409.91194, F.S.; creating the Medical Care Advisory Committee under the Agency for Health Care Administration; providing for membership, meetings, and duties; providing for reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses; requiring a report to the Legislature; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 409.91194, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

409.91194 Medical Care Advisory Committee.--

- (1) The Secretary for Health Care Administration shall appoint a Medical Care Advisory Committee to advise the Agency for Health Care Administration about the Florida Medicaid program, consistent with the requirements of federal law.
- (2) The committee shall be composed of not fewer than 15 or more than 25 members, with at least 51 percent of the membership consisting of current or former Medicaid recipients, their parents or guardians, or Medicaid advocates, including representatives of special needs populations. The terms of office of the members shall be for 3 years, and members may serve no more than two consecutive 3-year terms. However, a term of less than 3 years may be used to ensure that no more than five members' terms expire during the same calendar year. A vacancy occurring during a term shall be filled for the

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unexpired portion of the term in the same manner as the initial appointment was made.

- (3) At the first meeting each year, the members shall elect a chair and a vice chair. The committee shall meet at least quarterly, and committee members shall be provided written notice of the meetings at least 20 days before the date of the meeting. Subject to appropriation, the Agency for Health Care Administration shall provide staff and administrative support to the committee for the committee's activities and duties as provided in this section.
- (4) The members of the committee shall serve without compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses incurred in the discharge of official duties as provided in s. 112.061.
- (5) The duties and responsibilities of the committee include, but are not limited to, reviewing and commenting upon proposed amendments to the Medicaid state plan; reviewing and commenting upon proposed new Medicaid initiatives pertaining to health care benefits and beneficiary eligibility, including Medicaid waiver proposals and programs; participating in the development of policies and standards; providing advice about the content and dissemination of program materials; and providing advice about gaps in services or barriers to the use of services. The committee shall study and make recommendations regarding other Medicaid-related topics as suggested by the Legislature or the chair of the committee. The committee shall provide a written report on its activities and recommendations on or before November 30 of each year to the Governor, the
