29 (a) "Individual" means a single human being and does not 30 mean a firm, association of individuals, corporation, partnership, joint venture, sole proprietorship, or any other 31 32 entity. "Sensitive personal information" means any name or 33 (b) number that may be used, alone or in conjunction with any other 34 35 information, to identify a specific individual, including any alien registration number, government passport number, employer 36 37 or taxpayer identification number, Medicaid or food stamp account number, bank account number, credit or debit card 38 number, or unique biometric data, such as fingerprint, voice 39 print, retina or iris image, or other unique physical 40 41 representation. (2) Any person who willfully possesses sensitive personal 42 information concerning an individual without first obtaining 43 44 that individual's consent commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. 45 Section 3.
