The Department of Health shall compile data concerning the frequency and usage of electroconvulsive 14 therapy and psychosurgery procedures on children under 18 15 years of age in this state. The data shall include the 16 17 severity of the illness requiring these procedures, any 18 adverse events resulting from the procedures, the efficacy of the procedures, the number of these procedures performed over 19 a 3-year period in this state, the age of the children, and 2.0 21 the informed-consent process of each procedure. The data shall 22 also include the number of these procedures performed on 23 children who are in the custody of the Department of Children and Family Services or the Department of Juvenile Justice or 2.4 who reside in facilities operated through the Agency for 25 26 Persons with Disabilities. The department shall report this 27 data to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the 2.8 House of Representatives by January 1, 2008, and annually 29 thereafter. 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007. 31

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4	The committee substitute (CS) provides that the data to be compiled by the Department of Health (DOH) must include
5	information about the number of procedures performed on children in the custody of the Department of Children and
6	Families or the Department of Juvenile Justice, and on children who reside in Agency for Persons with Disabilities
7	facilities. It requires DOH to report the data to the Legislature on or before January 1, 2008, and annually
8	thereafter.
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
