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14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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16	Section 1. Paragraph (f) is added to subsection (15)
17	of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, to read:

22	(f) Effective July 1, 2007, the term "special risk
23	member "includes any member who is employed by a public acute
24	care hospital that serves as a trauma center and that provides
25	treatment to members of the public who have deadly or
26	crippling infectious diseases, members of the public who are
27	accused of or convicted of serious violent crimes, members of
28	the public who have been subjected to hazardous materials or
29	biological or chemical agents as a result of terrorism or
30	industrial accidents, or members of the public who have
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1 diseases the treatment of which requires interventions with 2 extremely toxic substances. Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida 3 Statutes, is amended to read: 4 5 121.0515 Special risk membership.--6 (2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special 7 risk member, must meet the following criteria: 8 (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 9 10 compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification 11 12 requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's 13 duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law 14 violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb 15 disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, 16 17 handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member 18 must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, 19 administrative support personnel, including, but not limited 20 21 to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in 22 accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 23 included; (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and 2.4 be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with 25 s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of 26 27 a local government employer or an agency of state government 2.8 with firefighting responsibilities. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting 29

30 of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct

31 supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or

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1 firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance 2 performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and 3 Consumer Services; or the member must be the supervisor or 4 command officer of a member or members who have such 5 б responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support 7 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 8 duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included and further 9 provided that all periods of creditable service in fire 10 prevention or firefighter training, or as the supervisor or 11 12 command officer of a member or members who have such 13 responsibilities, and for which the employer paid the special risk contribution rate, shall be included; 14 (c) The member must be employed as a correctional 15 officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 16 17 compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and 18 physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates 19 within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, 20 21 or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being 22 transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command 23 officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, 2.4 25 including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 26 27 personnel, shall not be included; however, wardens and 2.8 assistant wardens, as defined by rule, shall participate in 29 the Special Risk Class; 30 (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an 31

1 emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified 2 in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene 3 emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency 4 5 medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the 6 supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have 7 such responsibility. However, administrative support 8 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 9 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; 10 (e) The member must be employed as a community-based 11 12 correctional probation officer and be certified, or required 13 to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the 14 supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and 15 counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or 16 17 community controllees within the community; or the member must 18 be the supervisor of a member or members who have such responsibilities. Administrative support personnel, including, 19 but not limited to, those whose primary duties and 20 21 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal 22 services, and personnel management, shall not be included; 23 however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class; 2.4 (f) The member must be employed in one of the 25 following classes and must spend at least 75 percent of his or 26 27 her time performing duties which involve contact with patients 2.8 or inmates in a correctional or forensic facility or 29 institution: 30 1. In addition, the member's primary 9 10 duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, apprehension, arrest, 11 12 and counseling of assigned juveniles within the community; or 13 (h) The member must be employed by a law enforcement agency or medical examiner's office in a forensic discipline 14 recognized by the International Association for Identification 15 and must qualify for active membership in the International 16 17 Association for Identification. The member's primary duties 18 and responsibilities must include the collection, examination, preservation, documentation, preparation, or analysis of 19 physical evidence or testimony, or both, or the member must be 20 21 the direct supervisor, quality management supervisor, or 22 command officer of one or more individuals with such 23 responsibility. Administrative support personnel, including, 2.4 but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are clerical or in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, 25 shall not be included; or. 26 27 (i) The member must be employed by a public acute care 2.8 hospital that serves as a trauma center and that provides treatment to members of the public who have deadly or 29 crippling infectious diseases, members of the public who are 30 accused of or convicted of serious violent crimes, members of 31

1 the public who have been subjected to hazardous materials or 2 biological or chemical agents as a result of terrorism or industrial accidents, or members of the public who have 3 4 diseases the treatment of which requires interventions with extremely toxic substances. 5 б Section 3. The Legislature finds that in providing 7 treatment to members of the public who have deadly or 8 crippling infectious diseases, members of the public who are accused of or convicted of serious violent crimes, members of 9 10 the public who have been subjected to hazardous materials or biological or chemical agents as a result of terrorism or 11 12 industrial accidents, or members of the public who have diseases the treatment of which requires interventions with 13 extremely toxic substances, a member of the Florida Retirement 14 System who is employed by a public acute care hospital that 15 16 serves as a trauma center is serving an important state 17 interest and should be a member of the special risk class of 18 the Florida Retirement System. Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007. 19 20 21 22 SENATE SUMMARY 23 Includes a member of the Florida Retirement System in the special risk class of the system if the member is 2.4 employed by a public acute care hospital that serves as a trauma center and that provides treatment to members of 25 the public who have deadly or crippling infectious diseases, members of the public who are accused of or convicted of serious violent crimes, members of the 26 public who have been subjected to hazardous materials or biological or chemical agents as a result of terrorism or industrial accidents, or members of the public who have 27 28 diseases the treatment of which requires intervention with extremely toxic substances. 29 30 31
