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A bill to be entitled An act relating to notaries public; creating s. 117.021, F.S.; authorizing electronic notarization; requiring electronic signatures to include certain information; providing requirements for the use of a notary public seal with electronic signatures; providing that failure to comply with such requirements may result in specified sanctions against the notary public; authorizing the Department of State to adopt rules to ensure the security, reliability, and uniformity of the signatures and seals; providing an effective date.
