**I. Summary:**

This legislation continues the Emergency Response Trust Fund, FLAIR number 62-2-087, which is administered by the Department of Military Affairs.

This bill amends section 250.175(2)(a) of the Florida Statutes

The Emergency Response Trust Fund was created pursuant to chapter 2003-168, Laws of Florida.

The revenue sources for this trust fund are Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) reimbursements and transfers of state funds when approved by budget amendments processed pursuant to chapter 216, F.S. The trust fund is used to pay all operational costs incurred by the Florida National Guard when called to active duty. The Emergency Response Trust Fund is used by the Department of Military Affairs.

This legislation continues the Emergency Response Trust Fund within the Department of Military Affairs without changes.
