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An act relating to the Governor's School for Science and Technology; creating s. 1002.371, F.S.; creating the Governor's School for Science and Technology; requiring the Florida Virtual School to manage and control the Governor's School for Science and Technology; providing criteria governing such management and control; providing that the Governor's School for Science and Technology is a public school for selected students in grades 9 through 12 who enroll in the school and reside on the school's premises; providing for location of the school in Brevard County; providing for commencement of the school's classes; requiring the school to offer specified programs; stating the mission of the school; requiring the Florida Virtual School to appoint a director of the Governor's School for Science and Technology and adopt rules concerning operation of the school and selection of individuals who are eliqible to enroll in that school; authorizing rulemaking by the Florida Virtual School; creating the Governor's School for Science and Technology Advisory Council; providing for purpose, membership, duties, and operation of the council; exempting the Governor's School for Science and Technology from certain requirements concerning curriculum and operations in the Florida School Code; providing for the Florida Virtual School to be the fiscal agent of the Governor's School for Science and Technology and to submit certain budget requests; providing for funding the Governor's School for

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Science and Technology; amending ss. 1000.04, 1002.20, and 1003.02, F.S., relating to the components for the delivery of public education, the rights of students and parents concerning public school choice, and parental notice of acceleration mechanisms by district school boards; conforming provisions to changes made by the act; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1002.371, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1002.371 Governor's School for Science and
Technology.--The Governor's School for Science and Technology
is established and shall be managed and controlled by the
Florida Virtual School in a manner that conforms to this

(1) The Governor's School for Science and Technology is a public school for grades 9 through 12. The attendance area for the school is the entire state; however, admission to the school is a privilege reserved for those qualified students who are selected and is not a right afforded to the general population of students in this state. The school shall be located in Brevard County and be situated where connections between the school and the Kennedy Space Center may most readily be established. Students enrolled in the school must reside on the school's premises. The school's first classes must commence in the 2009-2010 academic year. The school shall offer:

(a) Accelerated programs in the areas of math, science, and technology to qualified students in grades 9 through 12.

- (b) Summer programs for elementary, middle, or high school teachers.
- (2) The mission of the Governor's School for Science and Technology is to provide students in grades 9 through 12 with advanced educational opportunities in the areas of science, math, and technology in order to gain the knowledge and skills necessary to succeed in those areas. The Florida Virtual School shall administer and operate the Governor's School for Science and Technology and shall:
 - (a) Appoint a director; and

- (b) Adopt rules specifying:
- 1. The requirements that an individual must meet in order to be qualified for admission to the Governor's School for Science and Technology and the standards by which applicants will be selected for admission to the school. Priority must be given to individuals who excel or demonstrate interest in the areas of math, science, or technology. The requirements and standards may include, but are not limited to, scores on tests or favorable recommendations from teachers or other school officials.
- 2. The number of students that may be enrolled at the school given the resources that are available.
- 3. The procedures by which an individual may apply for admission to the school or appeal a decision concerning an application to attend the school. Such procedures must conform to applicable standards concerning the adequacy of due process.

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4. The procedures by which the school must operate so as to maximize achievement of its mission.

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- (3) The Florida Virtual School may adopt rules under ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer this section.
- (4) (a) The Governor's School for Science and Technology
 Advisory Council is created within the Florida Virtual School.

 The purpose of the advisory council is to provide the Florida
 Virtual School with insight, expertise, and recommendations
 concerning the development and implementation of a plan for the
 Governor's School for Science and Technology.
- (b) The advisory council consists of 13 members who shall be appointed by the board of trustees of the Florida Virtual School as follows:
- 1. One member representing the Technological Research and Development Authority.
- 2. Two members representing the Sunshine State Scholars Recognition Program.
- 3. One member representing the Florida Institute of Technology.
 - 4. One member representing the Department of Education.
- 5. Two members representing the Florida Center for

 Mathematics and Science Education Research created under s.

 1004.86.
- 108 <u>6. One member representing the Embry-Riddle Aeronautical</u>
 109 University.
- 7. One member representing the University of Central Florida.
 - 8. One member representing the University of Florida.

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9. One member representing the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

- 10. Two members representing the faculty of the Florida Virtual School.
- (c) Initial appointments shall be made by August 1, 2007. Advisory council members shall be appointed to 5-year terms, except that the initial terms shall be staggered so that five members are appointed to 3-year terms, four other members are appointed to 4-year terms, and four other members are appointed to 5-year terms. An advisory council member who is absent from three consecutive meetings of the council is automatically removed from the council. Any vacancy on the advisory council must be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. An advisory council member may not serve more than two consecutive terms.
- (d) The advisory council shall meet at least once each quarter. A majority of the members of the advisory council constitutes a quorum.
- (e) Members of the advisory council shall serve without compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses in accordance with s. 112.061 while performing their duties.
- (4) In order to facilitate innovative practices, the Governor's School for Science and Technology is exempt from each requirement of the Florida School Code which relates to curriculum and operations unless the requirement also relates to civil rights or student health, safety, and welfare. This subsection does not exempt the school from chapter 119 or s.

- (5) The Florida Virtual School is the fiscal agent of the Governor's School for Science and Technology and shall annually prepare and submit a legislative budget request for the Governor's School for Science and Technology in accordance with chapter 216.
- (6) Funding for room, board, and transportation of students of the Governor's School for Science and Technology shall be as authorized in the General Appropriations Act. Other funding for the Governor's School for Science and Technology shall be provided from:
 - (a) Appropriations from the Legislature or a state agency;
 - (b) Contributions or endowments from private entities; and
- (c) Moneys generated through the Florida Education Finance
 Program or a categorical fund by virtue of a student's
 enrollment in a public school. Moneys so generated must be
 provided for each student who is enrolled in the Governor's
 School for Science and Technology in the same manner and amount
 that such moneys would be provided to a district school board if
 the same student were enrolled in a standard public school.
- Section 2. Subsection (5) is added to section 1000.04, Florida Statutes, to read:
- 1000.04 Components for the delivery of public education within the Florida K-20 education system.--Florida's K-20 education system provides for the delivery of public education through publicly supported and controlled K-12 schools, community colleges, state universities and other postsecondary educational institutions, other educational institutions, and

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other educational services as provided or authorized by the Constitution and laws of the state.

- (5) THE GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL FOR SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY.--The Governor's School for Science and Technology is a component of the delivery of public education within Florida's K-20 education system.
- Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (6) of section 1002.20, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 1002.20 K-12 student and parent rights.--Parents of public school students must receive accurate and timely information regarding their child's academic progress and must be informed of ways they can help their child to succeed in school. K-12 students and their parents are afforded numerous statutory rights including, but not limited to, the following:
 - (6) EDUCATIONAL CHOICE. --

(a) Public school choices.--Parents of public school students may seek whatever public school choice options that are applicable to their students and are available to students in their school districts. These options may include controlled open enrollment, lab schools, charter schools, charter technical career centers, magnet schools, alternative schools, special programs, advanced placement, dual enrollment, International Baccalaureate, International General Certificate of Secondary Education (pre-AICE), Advanced International Certificate of Education, early admissions, credit by examination or demonstration of competency, the New World School of the Arts, the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind, the Governor's School for Science and Technology, and the Florida Virtual

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School. These options may also include the public school choice options of the Opportunity Scholarship Program and the McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program.

Section 4. Paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 1003.02, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.02 District school board operation and control of public K-12 education within the school district.--As provided in part II of chapter 1001, district school boards are constitutionally and statutorily charged with the operation and control of public K-12 education within their school district. The district school boards must establish, organize, and operate their public K-12 schools and educational programs, employees, and facilities. Their responsibilities include staff development, public K-12 school student education including education for exceptional students and students in juvenile justice programs, special programs, adult education programs, and career education programs. Additionally, district school boards must:

- (1) Provide for the proper accounting for all students of school age, for the attendance and control of students at school, and for proper attention to health, safety, and other matters relating to the welfare of students in the following fields:
- (i) Parental notification of acceleration mechanisms.--At the beginning of each school year, notify parents of students in or entering high school of the opportunity and benefits of advanced placement, International Baccalaureate, Advanced International Certificate of Education, dual enrollment, the

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Governor's School for Science and Technology, and Florida Virtual School courses.

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Section 5. The sum of \$1 million is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Florida Virtual School for the purpose of paying salaries and other administrative expenses necessary to develop a plan, secure facilities, develop the sequence of courses for each grade level, and undertake other activities necessary to commence operation of the Governor's School for Science and Technology in the 2009-2010 academic year.

Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
