18	Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section
19	381.0072, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
20	381.0072 Food service protectionIt shall be the
21	duty of the Department of Health to adopt and enforce
22	sanitation rules consistent with law to ensure the protection
23	of the public from food-borne illness. These rules shall
24	provide the standards and requirements for the storage,
25	preparation, serving, or display of food in food service
26	establishments as defined in this section and which are not
27	permitted or licensed under chapter 500 or chapter 509.
28	(1) DEFINITIONSAs used in this section, the term:
29	(b) "Food service establishment" means any facility,
30	as described in this paragraph, where food is prepared and
31	intended for individual portion service, and includes the site

at which individual portions are provided. The term includes 2 any such facility regardless of whether consumption is on or off the premises and regardless of whether there is a charge 3 for the food. The term includes detention facilities, child 4 care facilities, schools, institutions, civic or fraternal 5 6 organizations, bars and lounges and facilities used at 7 temporary food events, mobile food units, and vending machines 8 at any facility regulated under this section. The term does not include private homes where food is prepared or served for 9 10 individual family consumption; nor does the term include churches, synagogues, or other not-for-profit religious 11 12 organizations as long as these organizations serve only their 13 members and guests and do not advertise food or drink for public consumption, or any facility or establishment permitted 14 or licensed under chapter 500 or chapter 509; nor does the 15 term include any theater, if the primary use is as a theater 16 and if patron service is limited to food items customarily 18 served to the admittees of theaters; nor does the term include a research and development test kitchen limited to the use of 19 employees and which is not open to the general public; nor 20 21 does the term include restrooms in a public airport as defined in ss. 330.27(2) and 330.27(6) which are not located within a 22 23 food service establishment. - 1. Any place maintained and operated by a public or private school, college, or university:
  - a. For the use of students and faculty; or
- b. Temporarily to serve such events as fairs, carnivals, and athletic contests.
- 2. Any eating place maintained and operated by a church or a religious, nonprofit fraternal, or nonprofit civic organization:
  - a. For the use of members and associates; or
- 10 b. Temporarily to serve such events as fairs, carnivals, or athletic contests. 11
- 12 3. Any eating place located on an airplane, train, 13 bus, or watercraft which is a common carrier.
- 4. Any eating place maintained by a hospital, nursing 14 home, sanitarium, assisted living facility, adult day care 15 center, or other similar place that is regulated under s. 16 17 381.0072.

10	Section 3. The Division of Hotels and Restaurants
11	within the Department of Business and Professional Regulation
12	shall inspect each food service establishment and its toilet
13	facilities as often as necessary to ensure compliance with
14	applicable laws and rules. The division shall have the right
15	of entry and access to these food service establishments at
16	any reasonable time. In inspecting food service establishments
17	as provided under this section, the division shall provide
18	each inspected establishment with the food recovery brochure
19	developed under s. 570.0725, Florida Statutes.
20	(1) A toilet facility in a food service establishment
21	licensed under chapter 509, Florida Statutes, must meet the
22	following minimum sanitation standards:
23	(a) Each toilet facility located on the premises of
24	the food service establishment must be completely enclosed and
25	provided with a tight-fitting, self-closing door. Such door
26	may not be left open except during cleaning or maintenance.
27	(b) Toilet facilities that are used by patrons must be
28	situated so that a patron does not pass through
29	food-preparation or utensil-washing areas.
30	(c) Toilet fixtures must be cleanable.

1	(d) Toilet facilities, including rooms and fixtures,
2	must be kept clean and in good repair.
3	(e) The floors must be made of a nonabsorbent material
4	and cleaned daily. The requirement that floors be made of a
5	nonabsorbent material applies only to food service
6	establishments that are constructed or substantially remodeled
7	after July 1, 2007.
8	(f) Receptacles must be provided for waste material,
9	and such receptacles must contain a trash-can liner. These
10	receptacles in toilet facilities for women must be covered.
11	Receptacles must be emptied as necessary to prevent excessive
12	accumulation of waste material.
13	(q) A supply of hand-cleansing, antibacterial soap or
14	detergent must be available in each toilet facility, and hot
15	and cold running water must be available at each hand-washing
16	sink within a toilet facility. A supply of sanitary towels or
17	a hand-drying device providing heated air must be located in
18	each toilet facility. Applicable to food service
19	establishments that are constructed or substantially remodeled
20	after July 1, 2007, hand-washing sinks that have an automatic
21	shut-off must run for a minimum of 20 seconds. Hand-washing
22	sinks, soap dispensers, hand-drying devices, and all related
23	fixtures must be kept clean and in good repair.
24	(h) A supply of toilet tissue must be provided in each
25	toilet stall at all times.
26	(i) Each toilet facility must be lighted and
27	ventilated. This requirement applies only to food service
28	establishments that are constructed or substantially remodeled
29	after July 1, 2007.
30	(j) A sign or poster that notifies food service
31	employees to wash their hands must be provided at each

1	hand-washing sink used by food service employees and must be
2	clearly visible to food service employees.
3	(2) The division may issue a warning or an
4	administrative complaint to, or may issue an emergency order
5	for the immediate closure of, a food service establishment
6	that fails to meet the minimum sanitation standards required
7	by subsection (1).
8	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.

10	STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR
11	Senate Bill 1462
12	
13	The committee substitute amends the definition of "food service establishment" to exclude restrooms in a public
14	airport. The committee substitute requires the Division of Hotels and Restaurants (division) within the Department of
15	Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) to inspect the toilet facilities of food service establishments regulated by
16	the DBPR. The division will provide each establishment a food recovery brochure. The division may issue administrative
17	penalties. The committee substitute no longer addresses food service establishments inspected by the Department of Health.
