Acute management and ongoing monitoring of chronic 50 conditions, such as asthma, diabetes, and seizure disorder, in conjunction with a student's regular doctor. 51 b. 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85 <u>(f)(e)</u> "School health services plan" means the document 86 that describes the services to be provided, the responsibility 87 for provision of the services, the anticipated expenditures to 88 provide the services, and evidence of cooperative planning by 89 local school districts and county health departments.

90 <u>(g) (f)</u> "Screening" means presumptive identification of 91 unknown or unrecognized diseases or defects by the application 92 of tests that can be given with ease and rapidity to apparently 93 healthy persons.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
