A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Commission for Independent Education; amending ss. 1005.21 and 1005.22, F.S.; revising provisions relating to the administration of the Commission for Independent Education; revising and increasing the commission membership; revising duties of the commission; deleting the requirement for submission of commission rules to the State Board of Education; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 Section 1. Subsections (1), (2), and (3) of section 1005.21, Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsection (7) is added to that section, to read:

 1005.21 Commission for Independent Education. --

(1) There is <u>created</u> established in the Department of Education the Commission for Independent Education, housed within the Department of Education for administrative purposes only. The department shall serve as the administrative agent of the commission by providing services, including payroll, procurement, and legal counsel. The commission shall be a separate budget entity not subject to control, supervision, or direction by the department in any manner, including, but not limited to, personnel, purchasing, transactions involving real or personal property, and budgetary matters, thereby exercising exercise independently all powers, duties, and functions

prescribed by law. The commission shall authorize the granting

of diplomas and degrees by any independent postsecondary educational institution under its jurisdiction.

- (2) The Commission for Independent Education shall consist of <u>nine</u> seven members who are residents of this state. The commission shall function in matters concerning independent postsecondary educational institutions in consumer protection, program improvement, and licensure for institutions under its purview. The Governor shall appoint the members of the commission who are subject to confirmation by the Senate. The membership of the commission shall consist of:
- (a) Two members who are either owners or employees representatives of independent colleges or universities licensed by the commission.
- (b) Two <u>members who are either owners or employees</u> representatives of independent, nondegree-granting schools licensed by the commission.
- (c) One member who is either an owner or employee of an independent, nonaccredited school licensed by the commission.
- (d) Two members who are either owners or employees of independent colleges or schools licensed by the commission.
- $\underline{\text{(e)}}$ One member from a public school district or community college who is an administrator of career education.
- (d) One representative of a college that meets the criteria of s. 1005.06(1)(f).
- $\underline{\text{(f)}}$ One lay member who is not affiliated with an independent postsecondary educational institution.
- (3) The members of the commission shall be appointed to 3-year terms and $\underline{\text{serve}}$ until their successors are appointed and

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qualified. If a vacancy on the commission occurs before the expiration of a term, the Governor shall appoint a successor to serve the unexpired portion of the term.

- (7) The commission shall appoint, review, and fix the salary of a person to serve as the executive director and have sole authority to remove such person at its pleasure. The executive director shall supervise, direct, coordinate, and administer all activities necessary to fulfill the commission's statutory responsibilities and have the authority to hire staff necessary to assist in fulfilling these responsibilities.
- Section 2. Paragraphs (b) and (e) of subsection (1) and paragraph (e) of subsection (2) of section 1005.22, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
 - 1005.22 Powers and duties of commission.--
 - (1) The commission shall:

- (b) Annually select a chairperson and a vice chairpersonappoint and review an executive director, and authorize the
 executive director to appoint employees of the commission.
- (e) Administer the provisions of this chapter. To this end, the commission has the following administrative powers and responsibilities:
- 1. The commission shall have the authority to adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer the provisions of this chapter for the operation and establishment of independent postsecondary educational institutions. The commission shall submit the rules to the State Board of Education for approval or disapproval. If the state board does

not act on a rule within 60 days after receiving it, the rule shall be filed immediately with the Department of State.

- 2. The commission shall submit an annual budget to the Governor State Board of Education.
- 3. The commission shall transmit all fees, donations, and other receipts of money to the Institutional Assessment Trust Fund.
- assist in the application and enforcement of its powers and duties. The chief financial officer of the Department of

 Education Chief Financial Officer shall pay out all moneys and funds as directed under this chapter upon vouchers approved by the executive director of the commission Department of Education for all lawful purposes necessary to administering this chapter. The commission shall make annual reports to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives State

 Board of Education showing in detail amounts received and all expenditures. The commission shall include in its annual report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives State Board of Education a statement of its major activities during the period covered by the report.
 - (2) The commission may:

- (e) Advise the Governor, the Legislature, the State Board of Education, the Council for Education Policy Research and Improvement, and the Commissioner of Education on issues relating to private postsecondary education.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
