(2) The commission shall consist of nine members who are residents of this state. The Governor shall appoint the members of the commission subject to confirmation by the Senate. The membership of the commission shall consist of:

- (a) Two members who are either owners or employees of independent colleges or universities licensed by the commission.
- (b) Two members who are either owners or employees of independent, nondegree-granting schools licensed by the commission.
- (c) One member who is either an owner or employee of an independent, nonaccredited school licensed by the commission.
- (d) One member who is either an owner or employee of an independent college or school licensed by the commission.
- (e) One member from a public school district or community college who is an administrator of career education.
- (f) One representative of a college that meets the criteria of s. 1005.06(1)(f).
- (g) One lay member who is not affiliated with an independent postsecondary educational institution.
- year terms and serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. If a vacancy on the commission occurs before the expiration of a term, the Governor shall appoint a successor to serve the unexpired portion of the term.
- (4) The commission shall meet at least four times each fiscal year.
- (5) Members of the commission are entitled to reimbursement for travel and per diem expenses, as provided in

- (6) Each member is accountable to the Governor for the proper performance of the duties of his or her office. The Governor may remove from office any member for cause.
- (7) The commission shall be housed within the Department of Education for administrative purposes only.
- (a) The department shall provide support services for the commission. At a minimum, the support services provided to the commission shall include accounting, procurement, legal counsel, printing, computer and Internet support, personnel and human resources support, support for accountability initiatives, support for agency inspector general activities, and administrative support as needed for trust funds utilized for commission activities.
- (b) The commission shall not be subject to control, supervision, or direction by the Department of Education in any manner, including, but not limited to, personnel, procurement, transactions involving real or personal property, and budgetary matters, thereby exercising independently all powers, duties, and functions prescribed by law.
- (8) The commission shall appoint, review, and fix the salary of a person to serve as the executive director and have sole authority to remove such person at its pleasure. The executive director shall supervise, direct, coordinate, and administer all activities necessary to fulfill the commission's statutory responsibilities and have the authority to hire staff necessary to assist in fulfilling these responsibilities. The department shall allocate sufficient salary rate and authorized

positions to the commission to enable the commission to administer this chapter.

Section 2. Paragraphs (b) and (e) of subsection (1) and paragraph (e) of subsection (2) of section 1005.22, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

1005.22 Powers and duties of commission. --

(1) The commission shall:

- (b) Annually select a chairperson and a vice chairpersonappoint and review an executive director, and authorize the
  executive director to appoint employees of the commission.
- (e) Administer the provisions of this chapter. To this end, the commission has the following administrative powers and responsibilities:
- 1. The commission is authorized to shall adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer the provisions of this chapter for the operation and establishment of independent postsecondary educational institutions. The commission shall submit the rules to the State Board of Education for approval or disapproval. If the state board does not act on a rule within 60 days after receiving it, the rule shall be filed immediately with the Department of State.
- 2. The commission shall prepare a legislative budget request and submit it through the State Board of Education for inclusion in the K-20 legislative budget request submit an annual budget to the State Board of Education.
- 3. The commission shall transmit all fees, donations, and other receipts of money to the Institutional Assessment Trust Fund.

4. The commission shall expend funds as necessary to assist in the application and enforcement of its powers and duties. The Chief Financial Officer shall pay out all moneys and funds as directed under this chapter upon vouchers approved by the executive director of the commission Department of Education for all lawful purposes necessary to administering this chapter. The commission shall make annual reports to the Executive Office of the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives State Board of Education showing in detail amounts received and all expenditures. The commission shall include in its annual report to the State Board of Education a statement of its major activities during the period covered by the report.

(2) The commission may:

- (e) Advise the Governor, the Legislature, the State Board of Education, the Council for Education Policy Research and Improvement, and the Commissioner of Education on issues relating to private postsecondary education.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
