HB 1589, Engrossed 1 2007

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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to Indian River County; providing definitions; requiring voter approval of any amendment to the Indian River County Comprehensive Plan which expands the urban service boundary; requiring a referendum; providing a ballot statement; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, Indian River County is a noncharter county operating under Section 1(f), Article VIII of the State Constitution, with the power of self-government as is provided by general or special law, and

WHEREAS, part II of chapter 163, Florida Statutes, provides authority for the board of county commissioners of Indian River County to exercise comprehensive land use and zoning power for property within the unincorporated area of the county, and

WHEREAS, the Indian River County Comprehensive Plan adopted pursuant to part II of chapter 163, Florida Statutes, establishes a county urban service boundary, and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2006, the voters of Indian River County approved a nonbinding referendum that favored the adoption of a special act for Indian River County by the Legislature to require voter approval of any amendment to the Indian River County Comprehensive Plan which expands the urban service boundary, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. As used in this act:

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(1) "Board of county commissioners" means the governing body of Indian River County.

- (2) "County" means Indian River County.
- (3) "Urban service boundary" means the geographical area established by the county in accordance with section 163.3177, Florida Statutes.

Section 2. The Indian River County urban service boundary may be expanded only by the board of county commissioners upon approval of a majority of those qualified electors of the county voting in a referendum called for that purpose by the board of county commissioners to be held in accordance with the provisions of law relating to elections then in force.

Section 3. In conjunction with the next countywide general election, and in accordance with the general laws governing elections, the Supervisor of Elections of Indian River County shall conduct a referendum of qualified electors of the county for the purpose of posing the following question:

Shall legislation be enacted to require referendum approval of any future expansion of the urban service boundary area by the board of county commissioners?

Section 4. This act shall take effect only upon its approval by a majority of those qualified electors of the county voting in a referendum held in accordance with section 3, except that this section and section 3 shall take effect upon becoming a law.
