I. Summary:

The bill requires each school district to make information available regarding the human sexuality and pregnancy and disease prevention curriculum provided to secondary school students. The curriculum information must be posted on the school district website or delivered through the most commonly used method of parental and community notification. The communication must also include the procedures available for reviewing the curriculum and provisions for parents and the community to offer input or comments.

This bill amends section 1003.42 of the Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

Current law provides for required instruction in comprehensive health education to include an awareness of the benefits of sexual abstinence as the expected standard and the consequences of teenage pregnancy.¹ Additionally, a parent may request in writing that a student be exempted from instruction in reproductive health or any disease without any penalty.² Currently, there is no requirement in law that school districts notify parents of the nature of human sexuality instruction offered to students, regardless of whether the instruction is abstinence-only or abstinence-based, often referred to in the literature as Abstinence Plus,³ or alternative instruction methods other than abstinence.

In order to address and maintain local-level decision-making, s. 1001.42(17)(a), F.S., requires district school boards to adopt policies that encourage and enhance maximum decision making appropriate to the school site for instructional materials, technology, and implementation of student health and fitness. Section 1003.42(3), F.S., provides that course requirements, which include HIV/AIDS and human sexuality instructional activities, shall not interfere with curriculum locally determined to be aligned with local values and concerns. The Florida Department of Education also includes this language as a disclaimer within each health-related course description.⁴

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill requires each school district to make information available to parents and the community regarding the human sexuality and pregnancy and disease prevention instruction provided to secondary school students. The information concerning this instructional curriculum must be posted on the district website or delivered through the most commonly used method of parental and community notification. The communication must also include procedures available to parents and the community for the review of the curriculum and provisions for parent and community input or comments.
