A memorial to the United States Government, requesting the United States Government to grant deferred enforced departure immigration status to Venezuelan nationals seeking political asylum in the United States and requesting the Bureau of U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services to grant and expedite work authorization permits to Venezuelan nationals presently in the United States who are requesting asylum to avoid political persecution.

WHEREAS, today the government of President Hugo Chavez in Venezuela is persecuting the citizens of Venezuela for their political views, seizing private property, and systematically eliminating the freedoms of the Venezuelan people, and

WHEREAS, in addition to these transgressions against the citizens of Venezuela, President Hugo Chavez has sought to silence peaceful opposition to his government by placing heavy restrictions and penalties on media outlets that still permit criticism of the government, and

WHEREAS, in an effort to secure his personal rule, oppress Venezuelan freedoms, and establish himself as dictator, Hugo Chavez dissolved the democratically elected Venezuelan legislature to establish a congress under his control, manipulated elections, seized control of the National Electoral Council, nationalized private industry, abandoned private property rights, and generally assumed control over Venezuela's government and its institutions, and

WHEREAS, as President Chavez's rule of Venezuela becomes increasingly autocratic, promotes hate and anti-American and communist ideology, and is supportive of nations that sponsor terrorism, it is imperative that the United States reach out to the members of the Venezuelan community in this country who fear persecution from Hugo Chavez for speaking out against his regime, and

WHEREAS, "deferred enforced departure" is a humanitarian designation similar to "temporary protected status" that enables the United States Government to delay the deportation of groups of individuals who would otherwise be placed in danger if they were to be deported to a country in which there is instability for political or other reasons, and

WHEREAS, first used in 1990 and used five times since then, deferred enforced departure status is designated by the President and is generally granted to specific foreign nationals for 12 or 18 months, during which time persons are allowed to work in the United States if they obtain employment authorization, and

WHEREAS, the United States has long followed the principle that it will not return a foreign national to a country where his or her life or freedom would be threatened as a result of political persecution, and

WHEREAS, because thousands of Venezuelan nationals are seeking refuge in the United States and within this state in order to escape political persecution, it is consistent with the founding principles of our nation and the character of our state that they be provided sanctuary and protection, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the United States Government is requested to grant "deferred enforced departure" immigration status to Venezuelan nationals seeking political asylum in the United States who would be placed in danger as a result of political persecution and the Bureau of U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services should grant and expedite work authorization permits to Venezuelan nationals presently in the United States who are requesting asylum to avoid political persecution by the government of Venezuelan dictator Hugo Chavez.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
