However, a gift 11 certificate may have an expiration date of not less than 3 years if it is provided as a free benefit pursuant to an 12 13 employee-incentive program, consumer-loyalty program, or promotional program, or is provided for a charitable purpose, 14 15 and payment of consideration is not required. In addition, a gift certificate may have an expiration date if it is provided 16 as part of a larger package related to a convention, 17 conference, or vacation having a limited duration so long as 18 19 the majority of the value paid by the recipient is 20 attributable to the convention, conference, or vacation. 21 (b) Paragraph (a) does not apply to a gift certificate 22 or credit memo sold or issued by a financial institution, as defined in s. 655.005, or to a money transmitter, as defined 23 2.4 in s. 560.103, if the gift certificate or credit memo is redeemable by all merchants that accept monetary consideration 25 remitted through the financial institution or money 26 transmitter that sold or issued the gift certificate or credit 27 28 memo.29 Section 2.
