Paragraph (f) is added to subsection (15) 15 of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, to read: 16 17 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases 18 as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 19 20 (15) 21 (f) Effective October 1, 2007, the term "special risk 22 member" includes any member who is employed by the Department 23 of Corrections, the Department of Children and Family Services, the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, or the 2.4 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and meets the 25 special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(i). 26 27 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida 2.8 Statutes, is amended to read: 29 121.0515 Special risk membership.--30 (2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special risk member, must meet the following criteria: 31

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1 (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement 2 officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected 3 police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification 4 requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's 5 б duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, 7 apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law 8 violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, 9 handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member 10 must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or 11 12 members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, 13 administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in 14 15 accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; 16 17 (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and 18 be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of 19 a local government employer or an agency of state government 20 21 with firefighting responsibilities. In addition, the member's 22 duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting 23 of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or 2.4 firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance 25 26 performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the 27 Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and 2.8 Consumer Services; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such 29 responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support 30

31 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary

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1 duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included and further 2 provided that all periods of creditable service in fire 3 prevention or firefighter training, or as the supervisor or 4 command officer of a member or members who have such 5 6 responsibilities, and for which the employer paid the special 7 risk contribution rate, shall be included; 8 (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 9 compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary 10 duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical 11 12 restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a 13 prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being 14 transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command 15 16 officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; 17 provided, however, administrative support personnel, 18 including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 19 personnel, shall not be included; however, wardens and 20 21 assistant wardens, as defined by rule, shall participate in 22 the Special Risk Class; 23 (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an 24 emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified 25 26 in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's 27 primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene 2.8 emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the 29 supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have 30 such responsibility. However, administrative support 31

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1 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 2 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; 3 4 (e) The member must be employed as a community-based correctional probation officer and be certified, or required 5 б to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, 7 the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the 8 supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and 9 counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or 10 community controllees within the community; or the member must be the supervisor of a member or members who have such 11 12 responsibilities. Administrative support personnel, including, 13 but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal 14 services, and personnel management, shall not be included; 15 however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit 16 17 administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class; 18 (f) The member must be employed in one of the following classes and must spend at least 75 percent of his or 19 her time performing duties which involve contact with patients 20 21 or inmates in a correctional or forensic facility or 2.2 institution: 23 1. The member's primary duties and responsibilities must include the collection, examination, 9 preservation, documentation, preparation, or analysis of 10 physical evidence or testimony, or both, or the member must be 11 12 the direct supervisor, quality management supervisor, or 13 command officer of one or more individuals with such 14 responsibility. 13	Section 3. <u>The Legislature finds that a proper and</u>
14	legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees
15	of the state and its political subdivisions and the
16	dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and
17	retirees are extended the basic protections afforded by
18	governmental retirement systems. These persons must be
19	provided benefits that are fair and adequate and that are
20	managed, administered, and funded in a sound actuarial manner,
21	as required by Section 14, Article X of the State Constitution
22	and part VII of chapter 112, Florida Statutes. Therefore, the
23	Legislature hereby determines and declares that this act
24	fulfills an important state interest.
25	Section 4. This act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
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
