21	member" includes any member who is employed by the Department
22	of Corrections, the Department of Children and Family
23	Services, or the Agency for Persons with Disabilities and

In addition, the member's 3 duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, 4 5 apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, 8 handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or 9 10 members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited 11 12 to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in 13 accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; 14

(b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of a local government employer or an agency of state government with firefighting responsibilities. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included and further

11	Section 3. The Legislature finds that a proper and
12	legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees
13	of the state and its political subdivisions and the
14	dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and
15	retirees are extended the basic protections afforded by
16	governmental retirement systems. These persons must be
17	provided benefits that are fair and adequate and that are
18	managed, administered, and funded in a sound actuarial manner,
19	as required by Section 14, Article X of the State Constitution
20	and part VII of chapter 112, Florida Statutes. Therefore, the

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28	The Committee Substitute reduces the job classes and employees affected by the upgrading to the special risk retirement class
29	and further lowers the fiscal impact by about forty percent.
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
