On page 1, between lines 16 and 17,

insert:

Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section
893.03, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

893.03 Standards and schedules.--The substances
enumerated in this section are controlled by this chapter.
The controlled substances listed or to be listed in Schedules
I, II, III, IV, and V are included by whatever official,
common, usual, chemical, or trade name designated. The
provisions of this section shall not be construed to include
within any of the schedules contained in this section any
excluded drugs listed within the purview of 21 C.F.R. s.
1308.22, styled "Excluded Substances"; 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.24,
styled "Exempt Chemical Preparations"; 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.32,
styled "Exempted Prescription Products"; or 21 C.F.R. s.
1308.34, styled "Exempt Anabolic Steroid Products."

1 (1) SCHEDULE I.--A substance in Schedule I has a high
 2 potential for abuse and has no currently accepted medical use
 3 in treatment in the United States and in its use under medical
 4 supervision does not meet accepted safety standards. The
 5 following substances are controlled in Schedule I:

6 (c) Unless specifically excepted or unless listed in
 7 another schedule, any material, compound, mixture, or
 8 preparation which contains any quantity of the following
 9 hallucinogenic substances or which contains any of their
 10 salts, isomers, and salts of isomers, whenever the existence
 11 of such salts, isomers, and salts of isomers is possible
 12 within the specific chemical designation:
