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20	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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22	Section 1. Limitation on employment of
23	noninstructional personnel by school districts
24	(1)(a) Notwithstanding any other law, the Department
25	of Education shall establish limitations on the number of
26	noninstructional personnel that may be employed by school
27	districts, based on the total number of full-time equivalent
28	students enrolled in the district.
29	(b) As used in this section, the term
30	"noninstructional personnel" means school district personnel

1 Are classified as administrative personnel or 2 managers under s. 1012.01, Florida Statutes; and 3 2. Do not perform any instructional duties. 4 (2)(a) Based on the prior year's enrollment, the department shall classify the school districts as follows: 5 б the 20 districts having the fewest number of full-time 7 equivalent students shall be classified as small-sized districts; the 10 districts having the largest number of 8 full-time equivalent students shall be classified as 9 10 large-sized districts; and the remaining districts shall be classified as medium-sized districts. 11 (b) By July 1 of each year, the department shall 12 13 establish a ratio for the school districts in each of the three size classifications. The ratio must specify the maximum 14 percentage of noninstructional personnel to full-time 15 equivalent students which a school district may employ. 16 17 However, the department shall provide for an adjustment in the 18 ratio for a district that contains a larger percentage of small schools than districts of equivalent size. The 19 20 department may not establish a ratio that exceeds the average 21 ratio of noninstructional personnel to full-time equivalent 2.2 students which existed within a particular district size 23 classification during the 2006-2007 school year. (c) In addition, the department shall determine the 2.4 average annual salary, including the cost of benefits, for 25 noninstructional personnel employed by school districts in 26 27 each of the three size classifications. 2.8 (3) The department shall determine each school year if any school district exceeds the maximum number of positions 29 30 allowed for noninstructional personnel. For each position that exceeds the maximum allowable number within a district, the 31

1	department shall deduct an amount equal to 50 percent of the
2	average cost of that position from the state funds allocated
3	to the district.
4	Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a
5	law.
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8	SENATE SUMMARY
9	Requires the Department of Education to limit the number of noninstructional personnel that may be employed by
10	school districts. Defines the term "noninstructional
11	personnel." Requires that the department classify school districts based on the number of full-time equivalent
12	students enrolled in the district. Requires that the department establish ratios within each district classification for the maximum percentage of
13	noninstructional personnel to full-time equivalent
14	students. Limits the maximum ratios that the department may establish. Requires a reduction in state funds for
15	any school district that exceeds the maximum percentage of noninstructional personnel.
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
