Subsection (3) of section 316.2397, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 14 316.2397 Certain lights prohibited; exceptions.--15 (3) Vehicles of the fire department and fire patrol, 16 17 including vehicles of volunteer firefighters as permitted under s. 316.2398, vehicles of medical staff physicians or 18 technicians of medical facilities licensed by the state as 19 authorized under s. 316.2398, ambulances as authorized under 20 this chapter, and buses and taxicabs as authorized under s. 21 22 316.2399 are permitted to show or display red lights. Vehicles 23 of the fire department, fire patrol, police vehicles, and such ambulances and emergency vehicles of municipal and county 24 departments, public service corporations operated by private 25 corporations, the Department of Environmental Protection, the 26 Department of Transportation, and the Department of 27 2.8 Agriculture and Consumer Services as are designated or 29 authorized by their respective department or the chief of police of an incorporated city or any sheriff of any county 30 are hereby authorized to operate emergency lights and sirens 31

Wreckers, mosquito control fog and spray 2 vehicles, and emergency vehicles of governmental departments or public service corporations may show or display amber 3 lights when in actual operation or when a hazard exists 4 provided they are not used going to and from the scene of 5 6 operation or hazard without specific authorization of a law 7 enforcement officer or law enforcement agency. Wreckers must 8 use amber rotating or flashing lights while performing recoveries and loading on the roadside day or night, and may 9 use such lights while towing a vehicle on wheel lifts, slings, 10 or under reach if the operator of the wrecker deems such 11 12 lights necessary. A flatbed, car carrier, or rollback may not 13 use amber rotating or flashing lights when hauling a vehicle on the bed unless it creates a hazard to other motorists 14 because of protruding objects. Further, escort vehicles may 15 show or display amber lights when in the actual process of 16 17 escorting overdimensioned equipment, material, or buildings as 18 authorized by law. Vehicles owned or leased by private security agencies of private watch, quard, or patrol agencies 19 licensed pursuant to chapter 493 may show or display green and 20 21 amber lights, with either color being no greater than 50 22 percent of the lights displayed, while the security personnel 23 are engaged in security duties on private or public property patrolling condominium, cooperative, and private residential 2.4 25 and business communities by which employed and which traverse 26 public streets or highways. 27 Section 2.
