578-2669-07 1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to carbon monoxide detectors; 3 amending s. 509.211, F.S.; requiring that 4 certain public lodging establishments be 5 equipped with carbon monoxide sensor devices; б creating s. 553.885, F.S.; providing a short 7 title; requiring buildings constructed on or 8 after a specified date which have a 9 fossil-fuel-burning appliance, fireplace, or attached garage to have carbon monoxide alarms 10 installed; requiring the Florida Building 11 12 Commission to adopt rules; providing 13 definitions; providing an effective date. 14 WHEREAS, the general purpose and intent of this act is 15 16 to provide proper protection regulations in the best interest 17 of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of this 18 state, and WHEREAS, the specific intent and purpose of this act is 19 to create safety regulations requiring carbon monoxide 20 21 detectors after the occurrence of several incidents where 22 people have died as a result of carbon monoxide poisoning 23 under circumstances that were preventable, and WHEREAS, this act is named in memory of Janelle Bertot, 2.4 a talented and community-oriented 19-year-old college student 25 and daughter of a former Hialeah police officer, and Anthony 26 27 Perez, a 25-year-old senior at Florida International 2.8 University and the president of Pi Kappa Phi fraternity, who died on November 14, 2004, from carbon monoxide poisoning as a 29 result of carbon monoxide that leaked from their motor 30 31 vehicle, and

1 WHEREAS, through the efforts of Janelle's parents and 2 other dedicated volunteers, Janelle's Wishing Well, a charitable foundation, has been established to provide 3 scholarships to young people interested in health care and to 4 5 raise public awareness and create community outreach programs 6 on the dangers of carbon monoxide poisoning, and 7 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes and supports the 8 education and prevention efforts of Janelle's Wishing Well to advise young people of the lethal danger of carbon monoxide 9 poisoning, NOW, THEREFORE, 10 11 12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 13 Section 1. Subsection (5) is added to section 509.211, 14 Florida Statutes, to read: 15 16 509.211 Safety regulations.--17 (5) Every enclosed space or room containing a boiler that is regulated under chapter 554 and that is fired by the 18 direct application of energy from the combustion of fuels and 19 located in any portion of a public lodging establishment that 2.0 21 also contains sleeping rooms must be equipped with one or more 22 carbon monoxide sensor devices that bear the label of a 23 nationally recognized testing laboratory and have been tested and listed as complying with the most recent Underwriters 2.4 Laboratories, Inc., Standard 2034, or its equivalent, unless 25 the division has determined that carbon monoxide hazards have 26 otherwise been adequately mitigated. Such devices shall be 27 2.8 integrated with the public lodging establishment's fire-detection system. Any such installation or determination 29 shall be made in accordance with rules adopted by the 30 division. 31

3	553.885 Carbon monoxide alarm required
4	(1) This section may be cited as "Janelle's Law."
5	(2) Every building for which a building permit is
6	issued for new construction on or after July 1, 2008, and
7	having a fossil-fuel-burning heater or appliance, a fireplace,
8	or an attached garage must have an approved operational carbon
9	monoxide alarm installed within 10 feet of each room used for
10	<u>sleeping purposes.</u>
11	(3) The Florida Building Commission shall adopt rules
12	to administer this section and shall incorporate such
13	requirements into its next revision of the Florida Building
14	Code.
15	(4) As used in this section, the term:
16	(a) "Carbon monoxide alarm" means a device that is
17	meant for the purpose of detecting carbon monoxide, that
18	produces a distinct audible alarm, and that meets the
19	requirements of and is approved by the Florida Building
20	Commission.
21	<u>(b) "Fossil fuel" means coal, kerosene, oil, fuel</u>
22	gases, or other petroleum or hydrocarbon product that emits
23	carbon monoxide as a by-product of combustion.
24	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
