The players cover or mark those numbers on the bingo cards which they have purchased until a player receives a given order of numbers in sequence that has been preannounced for that particular game. This player calls out "bingo" and is declared the winner of a predetermined prize. More than one game may be played upon a bingo card, and numbers called for one game may be used for a succeeding game or games.

(b) "Bingo card" means and refers to the flat piece of paper or thin pasteboard employed by players engaged in the game of bingo. The bingo card shall have not fewer than 24 playing numbers printed on it. These playing numbers shall range from 1 through 75, inclusive. More than one set of bingo numbers may be printed on any single piece of paper.

"Charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization" 42 (C) means an organization which has gualified for exemption from 43 federal income tax as an exempt organization under the 44 45 provisions of s. 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or 46 s. 528 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; which is engaged in charitable, civic, community, benevolent, 47 religious, or scholastic works or other similar activities; and 48 which has been in existence and active for a period of 3 years 49 50 or more.

51 (d) "Deal" means a separate set or package of not more 52 than 4,000 instant bingo tickets in which the predetermined 53 minimum prize payout is at least 65 percent of the total 54 receipts from the sale of the entire deal.

86 None of the provisions of this chapter shall be (2) (a) 87 construed to prohibit or prevent charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organizations engaged in charitable, civic, community, 88 benevolent, religious, or scholastic works or other similar 89 endeavors, which organizations have been in existence and active 90 for a period of 3 years or more, from conducting bingo games or 91 92 instant bingo, provided the entire proceeds derived from the 93 conduct of such games, less actual business expenses for 94 articles designed for and essential to the operation, conduct, and playing of bingo or instant bingo, are donated by such 95 organizations to the endeavors mentioned above. In no case may 96 97 the net proceeds from the conduct of such games be used for any other purpose whatsoever. (b) It is the express intent of the Legislature that no
charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization serve as a
sponsor of a bingo game <u>or instant bingo</u> conducted by another,
but such organization may only be directly involved in the
conduct of such a game as provided in this act.

(3) If an organization is not engaged in efforts of the
type set out above, its right to conduct bingo games hereunder
is conditioned upon the return of all the proceeds from such
games to the players in the form of prizes. If at the conclusion
of play on any day during which a bingo game is allowed to be
played under this section there remain proceeds which have not

been paid out as prizes, the organization conducting the game shall at the next scheduled day of play conduct bingo games without any charge to the players and shall continue to do so until the proceeds carried over from the previous days played have been exhausted. The right of a condominium association, a cooperative 119 (4)120 association, a homeowners' association as defined in s. 720.301, 121 a mobile home owners' association, a group of residents of a 122 mobile home park as defined in chapter 723, or a group of residents of a mobile home park or recreational vehicle park as 123 defined in chapter 513 to conduct bingo is conditioned upon the 124 125 return of the net proceeds from such games to players in the form of prizes after having deducted the actual business 126 127 expenses for such games for articles designed for and essential 128 to the operation, conduct, and playing of bingo. Any net 129 proceeds remaining after paying prizes may be donated by the association to a charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' 130 131 organization which is exempt from federal income tax under the 132 provisions of s. 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code to be used in such recipient organization's charitable, civic, community, 133 benevolent, religious, or scholastic works or similar activities 134 135 or, in the alternative, such remaining proceeds shall be used as 136 specified in subsection (3).

(b) Any organization conducting bingo open to the public
may refuse entry to any person who is objectionable or
undesirable to the sponsoring organization, but such refusal of
entry shall not be on the basis of race, creed, color, religion,
sex, national origin, marital status, or physical handicap.

(11) Bingo games <u>or instant bingo</u> may be held only on thefollowing premises:

(a) Property owned by the charitable, nonprofit, orveterans' organization.

(b) Property owned by the charitable, nonprofit, or
veterans' organization that will benefit by the proceeds.

(c) Property leased for a period of not less than 1 year by a charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization, providing the lease or rental agreement does not provide for the payment of a percentage of the proceeds generated at such premises to the lessor or any other party and providing the rental rate for such premises does not exceed the rental rates charged for similar premises in the same locale.

(d) Property owned by a municipality or a county when the
governing authority has, by appropriate ordinance or resolution,
specifically authorized the use of such property for the conduct
of such games.

195 With respect to bingo games conducted by a condominium (e) 196 association, a cooperative association, a homeowners' 197 association as defined in s. 720.301, a mobile home owners' association, a group of residents of a mobile home park as 198 defined in chapter 723, or a group of residents of a mobile home 199 park or recreational vehicle park as defined in chapter 513, 200 property owned by the association, property owned by the 201 residents of the mobile home park or recreational vehicle park, 202 203 or property which is a common area located within the 204 condominium, mobile home park, or recreational vehicle park.

(12) Each bingo game shall be conducted in accordance withthe following rules:

The objects, whether drawn or ejected, shall be 207 (a) 208 essentially equal as to size, shape, weight, and balance and as 209 to all other characteristics that may control their selection 210 from the receptacle. The caller shall cancel any game if, during 211 the course of a game, the mechanism used in the drawing or 212 ejection of objects becomes jammed in such a manner as to interfere with the accurate determination of the next number to 213 214 be announced or if the caller determines that more than one 215 object is labeled with the same number or that there is a number to be drawn without a corresponding object. Any player in a game 216 canceled pursuant to this paragraph shall be permitted to play 217 218 the next game free of charge.

(b) Prior to commencement of any bingo session, the member
in charge shall cause a verification to be made of all objects
to be placed in the receptacle and shall inspect the objects in
the presence of a disinterested person to ensure that all

objects are present and that there are no duplications or omissions of numbers on the objects. Any player shall be entitled to call for a verification of numbers before, during, and after a session.

(c) The card or sheet on which the game is played shall be
part of a deck, group, or series, no two of which may be alike
in any given game.

(d) All numbers shall be visibly displayed after beingdrawn and before being placed in the rack.

(e) A bona fide bingo shall consist of a predesignated
arrangement of numbers on a card or sheet that correspond with
the numbers on the objects drawn from the receptacle and
announced. Errors in numbers announced or misplaced in the rack
may not be recognized as a bingo.

(f) When a caller has started to vocally announce a number, the caller shall complete the call. If any player has obtained a bingo on a previous number, such player will share the prize with the player who gained bingo on the last number called.

(g) Numbers on the winning cards or sheets shall be announced and verified in the presence of another player. Any player shall be entitled at the time the winner is determined to call for a verification of numbers drawn. The verification shall be in the presence of the member designated to be in charge of the occasion or, if such person is also the caller, in the presence of an officer of the licensee.

(h) Upon determining a winner, the caller shall ask, "Arethere any other winners?" If no one replies, the caller shall

declare the game closed. No other player is entitled to share the prize unless she or he has declared a bingo prior to this announcement.

(i) Seats may not be held or reserved by an organization
or person involved in the conduct of any bingo game for players
not present, nor may any cards be set aside, held, or reserved
from one session to another for any player.

258 (13) (a) Instant bingo tickets must be sold at the price 259 printed on the ticket or on the game flare by the manufacturer, 260 not to exceed \$1. Discounts may not be given for the purchase of 261 multiple tickets, nor may tickets be given away free of charge. 262 (b) Each deal of instant bingo tickets must be accompanied 263 by a flare, and the flare must be posted before the sale of any 264 tickets in that deal.

The Department of the Lottery shall keep a list of at 311 (i) least five qualified instant bingo ticket manufacturers that are 312 313 authorized to sell instant bingo tickets within the state. The Department of the Lottery shall process all applications to be 314 315 placed on the list of instant bingo ticket manufacturers pursuant to s. 120.60. A distributor or charitable, nonprofit, 316 317 or veterans' organization may not purchase, distribute, or sell instant bingo tickets manufactured by any manufacturer other 318 319 than those qualified instant bingo ticket manufacturers listed by 320 the Department of the Lottery.

It has this power whether or not the 337 lands or facilities are contiguous to the lands of the 338 condominium, if they are intended to provide enjoyment, recreation, or other use or benefit to the unit owners. All of 339 these leaseholds, memberships, and other possessory or use 340 interests existing or created at the time of recording the 341 declaration must be stated and fully described in the 342 343 declaration. Subsequent to the recording of the declaration, the 344 association may not acquire or enter into agreements acquiring 345 these leaseholds, memberships, or other possessory or use interests except as authorized by the declaration. The 346 347 declaration may provide that the rental, membership fees, 348 operations, replacements, and other expenses are common expenses 349 and may impose covenants and restrictions concerning their use 350 and may contain other provisions not inconsistent with this 351 chapter. A condominium association may conduct bingo games as 352 provided in s. 849.0931.
