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29	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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Section 1. Section 465.014, Florida Statutes, is 2 amended to read: 3 465.014 Pharmacy technician. --(1) A No person other than a licensed pharmacist or 4 5 pharmacy intern may not engage in the practice of the profession of pharmacy, except that a licensed pharmacist may delegate to nonlicensed pharmacy technicians registered 8 pursuant to this section those duties, tasks, and functions which do not fall within the purview of s. 465.003(13). All 9 such delegated acts shall be performed under the direct 10 supervision of a licensed pharmacist who shall be responsible 11 12 for all such acts performed by persons under his or her 13 supervision. A registered pharmacy technician, under the supervision of a pharmacist, may initiate or receive 14 communications with a practitioner or his or her agent, on 15 behalf of a patient, regarding refill authorization requests. 16 A No licensed pharmacist may not shall supervise more than one 18 registered pharmacy technician unless otherwise permitted by the guidelines adopted by the board. The board shall establish 19 guidelines to be followed by licensees or permittees in 20 21 determining the circumstances under which a licensed 22 pharmacist may supervise more than one but not more than three 23 registered pharmacy technicians. 2.4 (2) Any person who wishes to work as a pharmacy 25 technician in this state must register by filing an application with the board on a form adopted by rule of the 26 board, together with a set of fingerprints, on a form and 27 2.8 under procedures specified by the board and a payment in an amount equal to the costs incurred by the board for the 29 criminal background check of the applicant. The board shall 30

1	registration to the Department of Law Enforcement for a
2	statewide criminal history check, and the Department of Law
3	Enforcement shall forward the fingerprints to the Federal
4	Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history check
5	of the applicant. For any subsequent renewal of the
6	applicant's registration, the board shall submit the required
7	information for a statewide criminal history check of the

9	shall register each applicant who has remitted a registration
10	fee set by the board, not to exceed \$50 biennially; has
11	completed the application form and remitted a nonrefundable
12	application fee set by the board, not to exceed \$50; has
13	submitted a set of fingerprints as provided in this
14	subsection; and meets the following requirements:
15	(a) Is at least 16 years of age.
16	(b) Within the 5 years preceding application, has not
17	been convicted of or pled quilty or nolo contendere to,
18	regardless of adjudication, any crime that relates to drug
19	trafficking or that otherwise directly relates to the
20	functions and duties of a pharmacy technician.
21	(3) A person whose license to practice pharmacy has
22	been denied, suspended, or restricted for disciplinary
23	purposes is not eligible to be registered as a pharmacy
24	technician.
25	(4) Notwithstanding the requirements of this section
26	or any other provision of law, a pharmacy technician student
27	may be placed in a pharmacy for the purpose of obtaining
28	practical training required by the body accrediting the
29	pharmacy technician training program. A pharmacy technician
30	student shall wear identification that indicates his or her
31	student status when performing the functions of a pharmacy

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technician, and registration under this section is not required.

- (5) Notwithstanding the requirements of this section or any other provision of law, a person licensed by the state as a pharmacy intern may be employed as a registered pharmacy technician without paying a registration fee or filing an application with the board to register as a pharmacy technician.
- (6) As a condition of registration renewal, a pharmacy technician shall complete 20 hours biennially of continuing education courses approved by the board or the Accreditation Council for Pharmaceutical Education, of which 4 hours must be via live presentation and 2 hours must be related to the prevention of medication errors and pharmacy law.
- (7) The board shall adopt rules that require each registration issued by the board under this section to be displayed in such a manner as to make it available to the public and to facilitate inspection by the department and such other rules as necessary to administer the provisions of this section.
- (8) If the board finds that an applicant for registration as a pharmacy technician or that a registered pharmacy technician has committed an act that constitutes grounds for discipline as set forth in s. 456.072(1) or has committed an act that constitutes grounds for denial of a license or disciplinary action as set forth in this chapter, including an act that constitutes a substantial violation of s. 456.072(1) or a violation of this chapter which occurred before the applicant or registrant was registered as a pharmacy technician, the board may enter an order imposing any

of the penalties specified in s. 456.072(2) against the 2 applicant or registrant. Section 2. Paragraph (d) is added to subsection (3) of 3 section 465.015, Florida Statutes, to read: 4 5 465.015 Violations and penalties.--6 (3) 7 (d) It is unlawful for a person who is not registered 8 as a pharmacy technician under this chapter, or who is not 9 otherwise exempt from the requirement to register as a 10 pharmacy technician, to perform the functions of a registered pharmacy technician or hold himself or herself out to others 11 12 as a person who is registered to perform the functions of a 13 registered pharmacy technician in this state. Subsection (5) of section 465.019, Florida 14 Statutes, is amended to read: 15 465.019 Institutional pharmacies; permits.--16 17 (5) All institutional pharmacies shall be under the 18 professional supervision of a consultant pharmacist, and the compounding and dispensing of medicinal drugs shall be done 19 only by a licensed pharmacist. Every institutional pharmacy 20 21 that employs or otherwise utilizes registered pharmacy 22 technicians shall have a written policy and procedures manual 23 specifying those duties, tasks, and functions which a pharmacy technician is allowed to perform. 2.4 Section 4. Section 465.0196, Florida Statutes, is 25 amended to read: 26 27 465.0196 Special pharmacy permits. -- Any person 2.8 desiring a permit to operate a special pharmacy shall apply to 29 the department for a special pharmacy permit. If the board certifies that the application complies with the applicable 30 laws and rules of the board governing the practice of the

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profession of pharmacy, the department shall issue the permit. 2 No permit shall be issued unless a licensed pharmacist is designated to undertake the professional supervision of the 3 compounding and dispensing of all drugs dispensed by the 4 pharmacy. The licensed pharmacist shall be responsible for 5 maintaining all drug records and for providing for the 7 security of the area in the facility in which the compounding, 8 storing, and dispensing of medicinal drugs occurs. The permittee shall notify the department within 10 days of any 9 10 change of the licensed pharmacist responsible for such duties. Internet pharmacy shall apply to the department for an Internet pharmacy permit. If the board certifies that the application complies with the applicable laws and rules of the board governing the practice of the profession of pharmacy, the department shall issue the permit. No permit shall be issued unless a licensed pharmacist is designated as the prescription department manager for dispensing medicinal drugs to persons in this state. The licensed pharmacist shall be responsible for maintaining all drug records and for providing for the security of the area in the facility in which the compounding, storing, and dispensing of medicinal drugs to persons in this state occurs. The permittee shall notify the department within 30 days of any change of the licensed

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pharmacist responsible for such duties. Every permittee that 2 employs or otherwise utilizes <u>registered</u> pharmacy technicians 3 shall have a written policy and procedures manual specifying 4 those duties, tasks, and functions which a registered pharmacy 5 technician is allowed to perform. 6 Section 6. Requires the Board of Pharmacy to set fees and rules to register pharmacy technicians. Requires an applicant for 11 registration as a pharmacy technician to submit 12 fingerprints.
