(2)(3) All public lodging establishments and all public food service establishments licensed under this chapter shall pay an annual fee of no more than \$10, which shall be included in the annual license fee and which shall be used for the sole purpose of funding the Hospitality Education Program.

- (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, grant funding under this section for the services described in paragraph (1)(b) shall include all expenses incident to providing those services, including the cost of staff support; student scholarships; compensation to program instructors for time spent in relevant training; special events or competitive events; and a reasonable stipend for travel, lodging, and meals for instructors and students participating in training or in related special events. All such expenses shall be in accordance with the budget submitted by the applicant in the grant application and approved by the division. The expenditure of all funds distributed under this section shall be subject to audit by the division.
- (4) The director of education shall formulate an annual budget, programs, and activities to accomplish the purposes of this section, in accordance with and subject to the advice and recommendations of the advisory council.
- Program must show that the total fees or charges estimated to be collected during the next fiscal year under this section will be dedicated solely to the estimated cost of funding the Hospitality Education Program, less any trust fund service charge imposed by s. 215.20.
