- (e) Administer the provisions of this chapter. To this end, the commission has the following administrative powers and responsibilities:
- 1. The commission <u>may</u> shall adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 <u>to administer the provisions of this chapter</u> for the operation and establishment of independent postsecondary educational institutions. The commission shall submit the rules to the State Board of Education for approval or disapproval. If the state board does not act on a rule within 60 days after receiving it, the rule shall be filed immediately with the Department of State.
- 2. The commission shall prepare a legislative budget request and submit it through an annual budget to the State Board of Education for inclusion in the K-20 legislative budget request.
- 3. The commission shall transmit all fees, donations, and other receipts of money to the Institutional Assessment Trust Fund.
- 4. The commission shall expend funds as necessary to assist in the application and enforcement of its powers and duties. The chief financial officer of the Department of Education shall pay out all moneys and funds as directed under this chapter upon vouchers approved by the executive director of the commission Department of Education for all lawful purposes necessary to administering this chapter.
