29 Helping middle school students to broaden their (d) aspirations beyond the stereotypes of gender, socioeconomic 30 31 status, and ethnicity. 32 (e) Integrating career education into the general middle school academic curriculum in order to promote intellectual 33 development and the acquisition of higher-level thinking and 34 35 problem-solving skills. Assisting with the development of the social skills, 36 (f) 37 personal values, and self-esteem of middle school students. (q) Working with the families of middle school students to 38 39 support their children's career aspirations. Beginning in the 2007-2008 school year, the School 40 (2) Board of Broward County and the School Board of Duval County 41 42 shall implement pilot projects in at least two, and not more 43 than four, middle schools in each school district designed to 44 meet the goals in subsection (1). Middle schools selected shall 45 be representative of both high-performing and low-performing 46 schools as measured by student achievement on the FCAT. Each 47 pilot project may target all students in each middle school 48 selected for the pilot project. 49 Middle school instructional and administrative staff (3) responsible for implementing each pilot project shall consult 50 with their respective regional workforce board for assistance in 51 developing each project and to obtain technical assistance and 52 resources to achieve the goals of the project. 53 (4) Each pilot project shall have an evaluation component 54 55 designed and conducted by the district school board, or designed 56 and conducted pursuant to a contract with a university school of

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57 education, in consultation with the Council for Education Policy Research and Improvement. (5) The Council for Education Policy Research and Improvement is responsible for reviewing each pilot project's evaluation and providing a report by January 1, 2009, to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on the effectiveness of each pilot project with recommendations and suggestions for expanding the programs statewide. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
