16	(1) DEFINITIONS
17	(a) "Agency" means:
18	1. The Governor in the exercise of all executive
19	powers other than those derived from the constitution.

21	a. State officer and state department, and each
22	departmental unit described in s. 20.04.
23	b. Authority, including a regional water supply
24	authority.
25	<u>c. Board.</u>
26	d. Commission, including the Commission on Ethics and
27	the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission when acting
28	pursuant to statutory authority derived from the Legislature.

30	f. Multicounty special district of which a majority of

Each other unit of government in the state, including counties and municipalities. 5 б (b) "Construction aggregate materials" means crushed stone, limestone, dolomite, limerock, shell rock, high-quality 7 8 sand, and other mined resources providing the basic material for concrete, asphalt, and road base. 9 10 (2) LEGISLATIVE INTENT.--The Legislature finds that there is a strategic and critical need for an available supply 11 12 of construction aggregate materials within the state and disruption of the supply would cause significant detriment to 13 the state's construction industry, transportation system, and 14 overall health, safety, and welfare of the state. 15 (3) AGENCY DECISIONMAKING. -- An agency considering a 16 17 proposed land use zoning change, comprehensive plan amendment, land use permit decision, or order must address the affect 18 such change, amendment, permit decision, or order would have 19 on the availability, transportation, and potential extraction 2.0 21 of construction aggregate materials on the local area, the 2.2 region, and the state. 23 (4) STRATEGIC AGGREGATES REVIEW TASK FORCE.--(a) The Strategic Aggregates Review Task Force is 2.4 created to evaluate the availability and disposition of 25 construction aggregate materials and related mining and land 26 27 use practices in this state. 2.8 (b) The task force shall be appointed by August 1, 2007, and shall be composed of the following 15 members: 29 30 31

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1 The President of the Senate, the Speaker of the 2 House of Representatives, and the Governor shall each appoint one member from each of the following groups: 3 4 a. The mining or construction industries. 5 The transportation industries, including seaports, b. 6 trucking, railroads, or roadbuilders. 7 c. Elected county government. 8 Environmental advocacy groups. d. 9 The Secretary of Environmental Protection or 2. 10 designee. The Secretary of Community Affairs or designee. 11 3. 12 The Secretary of Transportation or designee. 4. 13 (c) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation. Travel and per diem expenses for members who are 14 not state employees shall be paid by the Department of 15 Transportation in accordance with s. 112.061, Florida 16 17 Statutes. (d) The Department of Community Affairs shall organize 18 and provide administrative support for the task force and 19 20 coordinate with other state agencies and local governments in 21 obtaining and providing such data and information as may be 2.2 needed by the task force to complete its evaluation. The 23 department may conduct any supporting studies as are required to obtain needed information or otherwise assist the task 2.4 force in its review and deliberations. 25 (e) The Department of Transportation shall collect and 26 27 provide information to the task force relating to construction 2.8 aggregate materials and the amount of such materials used by the department on state road infrastructure projects, and 29 30 shall provide any technical and supporting information 31

3	(f) The task force shall report its findings to the
4	Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the
5	House of Representatives by December 15, 2007. The report must
6	identify locations with significant concentrations of
7	construction aggregate materials and recommend actions
8	intended to ensure the continued extraction and availability
9	of construction aggregate materials.
10	(q) The task force shall be dissolved on July 1, 2008.
11	Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a
12	law.
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15	SENATE SUMMARY
16	Establishes the Strategic Construction Aggregates Review Task Force. Provides for membership, staffing, reporting,
17	and expiration of the task force. Requires state agencies to consider the effect of decisionmaking on the
18	availability of construction aggregate materials
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
