20	to this section include premiums for major medical and
21	hospitalization insurance, but do not include premiums for
22	dental or vision insurance. Upon becoming eligible for
23	Medicare, a retiree's Sheriff's office health coverage will
24	become a secondary payer. When a retiree receiving this health
25	insurance benefit becomes eligible for Medicare, his health
26	coverage will convert to the Medicare Supplement health
27	insurance.
28	(a) In order to receive this benefit, the retiree must
29	have served with the Lee County Sheriff's Office for the 10
30	years immediately preceding his retirement. The retiree may
31	claim up to 5 years of creditable service earned while in the

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employ of another member agency within the Florida Retirement System. The Lee County Sheriff's Office shall verify all years 2. of creditable service claimed through the Division of 3 4 Retirement of the Department of Administration. (3)(c) The benefits provided in this section are 5 available only to an employee who retires after 15 years of 7 full-time service with the Lee County Sheriff's Office and who has participated in the Florida Retirement System (FRS) for a 8 minimum of 15 years of creditable service. A retiree may claim up to 5 years of creditable service with another FRS employer 10 11 provided that the last 10 years of employment must have been with the Lee County Sheriff's Office in a full-time position. 12 All years of creditable service with another Florida 13 Retirement System employer are subject to verification from 14 15 the Division of Retirement of the Department of Management Services. An employee is considered retired from the Florida 16 Retirement System at such time as he or she meets the 17 definition of "retiree" as described in section 121.021(60) or 18 19 section 121.4501(2)(j), Florida Statutes. The Lee County 20 Sheriff's Office shall base the percentage of a retiree's health insurance costs it will pay upon the number of years of 21 22 creditable service that the retiree has accumulated in the 23 Florida Retirement System. Fifteen years of creditable service entitles the retiree to have 75 percent of his health 2.4 insurance premiums paid by the sheriff's office. The sheriff's 25 26 office shall pay an additional 5 percent of the insurance premiums for each year of service in excess of 15 years until 27 reaching a maximum of 100 percent of the premium at 20 years 28 29 of service. The Lee County Sheriff's Office shall pay an additional one-twelfth of 1 percent of the premium for each 30 31 month served until the full 100 percent is paid. 9:00 AM 04/17/07 s2978b-go08-n02

2	Sheriff's Office after at least 15 10 years of $full-time$,
3	<u>creditable</u> service with the department , <u>as provided in</u>

6	receiving group health insurance benefits, individual or
7	family, by paying the current premium rate to the Lee County
