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24	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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26	Section 1. Chapter 74-522, Laws of Florida, as amended
27	by chapters 99-434 and 2003-329, Laws of Florida, is amended
28	to read:
29	Section 1. <u>Composition and purpose of board</u> There is
30	hereby created a civil service board, hereafter referred to as
31	the "board", composed of five (5) members whose duty it is to
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1 administer the terms of this act which shall apply to all 2 classified appointees deputy sheriffs and employees of the Lee County Sheriff's Office. 3 (1) The board shall consist of five (5) members who 4 shall be elected by a majority of persons voting or appointed 5 б as follows: 7 (a) One(1) member of the board will be the sheriff or 8 his or her designate. (b) One(1) member of the board will to be elected by 9 a majority of the employees with the rank of lieutenant or 10 above. An alternate member shall be elected at the same time 11 12 and in the same manner for this position. 13 (c) One(1) member of the board to be elected by a majority of the employees below with the rank of lieutenant 14 deputy or sergeant. An alternate member shall be elected at 15 the same time and in the same manner for this position. 16 17 (d) One(1) member to be an upstanding resident of Lee 18 County to be <u>selected</u> and <u>appointed</u> elected by the board <u>at</u> the first organizational meeting held on the first business 19 day of October after taking office. 20 21 (e) One(1) member of the board to be the <u>lead</u> 22 department chaplain or his or her designee, as determined by 23 the Sheriff. (f) Election for board members and their alternates of 2.4 the three (3) members shall be held on the second Tuesday of 25 26 at the first staff meeting in September, and the newly elected 27 member shall take with the members taking office on the 1st 2.8 day of October. 29 (g) Civilian employees not assigned a rank may vote for the position identified in paragraph (b) or (c), but not 30 both. If for any reason, a member of the board cannot serve, 31

1 an alternate member will be elected in the same manner as 2 provided in this section. (h) Alternate members shall serve if, for any reason, 3 a member of the board cannot serve. 4 5 (i) (h) All vacancies on the board will be filled by б the procedure established in this section. 7 (2) No board member shall be subject to any adverse 8 action in retaliation for his or her service on the board, decisions of the board, or performance of his or her official 9 duties in transacting business of the board. 10 (3) The term of office for elected board members shall 11 12 be 2 years. 13 Section 2. <u>Qualifications for board members.--</u>Members of the board shall be 18 twenty one (21) years of age or over, 14 15 of good moral character, a citizen of the United States of 16 America, a permanent resident of Florida, and must have 17 resided in Lee County for at least 1 = 0 one (1) year prior to his 18 or her appointment. Section 3. Affected employees. -- The civil service act, 19 as set forth, will encompass all classified employees members 20 21 of the Lee County Sheriff's Office. The term "classified 2.2 employees" shall include all full-time deputy sheriffs, 23 correctional officers, and civilian employees who have completed their original or reemployment probationary period. 2.4 "Classified employees" shall not include: any contractual 25 26 employees, appointees, volunteers, or other persons who do not 27 serve in a regularly budgeted position in the Sheriff's office 2.8 on a full-time basis; and the Sheriff or his or her second in 29 command, whether designated as chief deputy, undersheriff, or otherwise, except as to the Sheriff's obligations set forth 30 under sections 1, 2, and 15. All members of the sheriff's 31

1 office under the rank of chief deputy shall be classified 2 members of the civil service act. 3 Section 4. Board positions .-- The board shall, upon its organization, elect one(1) member as chairperson chairman and 4 one(1) member as secretary and they shall perform their 5 6 duties in accordance with the rules and regulations to be 7 adopted by the board from time to time as necessary to carry out the purpose of this act. 8 9 Section 5. Certification of the act.--This act shall 10 become operative upon the certification to the board by the sheriff that the office of the Sheriff of Lee County is 11 12 functioning under the civil service rules as established in 13 this document. When the certification of organization and capability has been filed by the sheriff, the board shall 14 forthwith acknowledge such certification. Thereafter, the 15 certification shall be irrevocable except by subsequent act of 16 17 Legislature. The act shall carry over from Sheriff to Sheriff 18 and it shall not be necessary for subsequent Sheriffs to recertify the act. 19 Section 6. <u>Powers of the board.--</u>The board, as a body, 20 21 shall have the power, subject to minimum requirements, to act 22 to: 23 (1) Investigate and enforce compliance by the Sheriff and any and all classified and unclassified employees of the 2.4 Sheriff's office with regards to the terms and conditions of 25 the act and implement investigations and determinations Make 26 27 investigations concerning the enforcement and effect of this 2.8 act, and to require observance of its provisions and the rules 29 and regulations made thereunder. 30 (2) Hear and determine appeals of complaints respecting the administration of this act. 31

1 (3) Establish and maintain a roster of all employees 2 in the classified service of the office of the sheriff showing their position, rank, compensation, benefits and place of 3 residence. 4 5 (4) Ascertain and record the duties and б responsibilities of appertaining to all positions of the 7 Sheriff's office in a manner approved by the board in the 8 classified service and classify such positions in the manner 9 hereafter provided. 10 (5) Keep any other records as may be necessary for the proper administration of this act. 11 12 (6) Issue subpoenas for the appearance of witnesses 13 and production of documents and things in connection with investigations and hearings conducted pursuant to this act. 14 Section 7. Positions after adoption of the act and 15 election of a new Sheriff. -- All classified employees persons 16 17 in the employ of the office of the Sheriff shall be retained 18 in the same capacity, at the time this act becomes operative, who have served for a period longer than one (1) year in a 19 position and rank shall now be under this act, retained as 20 21 same, without preliminary or performance tests but shall 22 thereafter be subject in all other respects to the provisions 23 of this act. In the event a new sheriff is elected to office in Lee County, all classified employees of the Sheriff's 2.4 25 office shall remain in the same position with the exception of those serving in a rank or grade immediately below the chief 26 27 deputy. These persons who comprise the Sheriff's executive and 2.8 administrative staff and who command a major component, subdivision, or bureau of the Sheriff's office personnel who 29 are ranked at captain or above, who may be subject to a one 30 31 (1) grade demotion in rank to lieutenant or above in order to

allow the Sheriff to establish his or her new administration. 1 2 The salary of all persons so demoted may be reduced to no less than the top of the grade to which they are demoted. If 3 transferred, the transfer shall be to a position equal in 4 terms of rank, pay, and benefits to those in which other 5 6 persons of the same rank serve. The elimination by a new 7 Sheriff of a position or grade under a previous administration 8 constitutes a demotion for purposes of this section. Section 8. Leaves of absence and military 9 service.--The Sheriff shall formulate reasonable rules 10 governing the granting of leaves of absence to members of the 11 12 Sheriff's office sheriff's office in good standing. Except as hereinafter provided, no leave of absence shall be approved 13 given for more than 1 one (1) year, however, such leaves may 14 be extended with the approval of the Sheriff upon the showing 15 16 of good cause, so long as the leave period does not exceed the 17 Sheriff's current term of office. 18 (1) All classified employees of persons employed by the Lee County Sheriff's office who shall be inducted in the 19 20 armed forces of the United States of America or who shall 21 voluntarily by enlistment enter into such forces in time of 22 war or national emergency shall, upon application to the 23 Sheriff, receive a military leave of absence for the duration of the period of service required. During the period of 2.4 service, all persons serving shall be entitled to all the 25 benefits and privileges of this act and shall retain all 26 27 rights of seniority. All persons shall be entitled to 2.8 reemployment in the same capacity and position they held at 29 the time of entering said military service, provided, however, that application for reinstatement to in such position must be 30 made by or on behalf of such employee within 3 three (3)31

1 months after termination of military service. Provided Further 2 that to be entitled to the benefits of this subsection, any discharge from such military service must have been honorable. 3 (2) This section shall not apply to persons who engage 4 themselves as private contractors for any security or 5 б peacekeeping force or any service provider not directly under 7 the supervision and control of the Armed Forces of the United States of America and the Commander In Chief of those forces. 8 9 Section 9. Qualifications for employment. -- The 10 minimum standards and qualifications for an original applicant for employment or reemployment as a classified employee of 11 12 deputy sheriff, or in any other capacity in the office of the 13 Sheriff of Lee County, shall be as follows: (1) All applicants for any position in the classified 14 service of the Sheriff's office must submit a complete, 15 written application for employment. 16 17 (2)(1) All applicants must be graduates of An 18 applicant shall have graduated from a duly accredited high school or possess shall have the equivalent of a high school 19 diploma from a school recognized by the state. 20 21 (3)(2) All applicants must An applicant shall be 22 physically capable of performing all functions and duties of 23 the position that they are seeking and must submit to a physical exam conducted by a physician licensed in this state 2.4 of a deputy sheriff as established by the board, and this 25 26 physical capacity shall be certified by a physician licensed 27 in this state and selected by the board. 2.8 (4) (4) (3) All applicants are required to submit to a background investigation, drug screen, polygraph, or CVSA 29 examination and oral interview No person is eligible to 30 31 receive public funds as a salary or for services rendered as a 7

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1 deputy sheriff of Lee County until such person has submitted 2 to the sheriff, a written application for employment and has 3 passed an oral examination. 4 (5)(4) All applicants An applicant shall not have been convicted of a felony of any kind, a crime involving moral 5 б turpitude, or of a misdemeanor for which the penalty is 7 greater be more than a \$300 three hundred dollar (\$300) fine and/or 90 ninety (90) days confinement. 8 (6) (6) (5) All applicants having military service must 9 10 submit a DD 214 indicating that their military service and discharge were under honorable conditions. Persons discharged 11 12 for medical conditions or reasons must be able to perform all 13 functions of the position for which they are applying An applicant with military service shall have an honorable 14 15 discharge. (7) In addition to the requirements in subsections 16 17 (1)-(6), all persons applying for certified law enforcement or 18 corrections positions must comply with the requirements of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and be eligible for 19 state certification. 2.0 21 Section 10. Appointments, promotions, and 2.2 transfers. -- Promotional procedures with respect to all 23 classified employees shall conform to Sheriff's office policies based on CALEA standards as adopted by the Sheriff's 2.4 office for so long as the Sheriff's office remains an 25 accredited agency. In the event that the Sheriff's office is 26 27 no longer an accredited agency, promotions will be made on a 2.8 merit basis considering work performance, knowledge of job, and other similar qualifications. All promotions will be made 29 30 by the Sheriff Promotions will be made on a merit basis such 31

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1	as work performance, knowledge of job and other
2	qualifications. All promotions will be made by the sheriff.
3	(1) Open positions will be publicly posted throughout
4	the Sheriff's office on department bulletin boards and
5	websites for a period of 7 days to allow for application by
6	qualified Sheriff's office employees who shall be entitled to
7	a preference for any position of higher grade or rank than an
8	entry level position Whenever there is an opening in any
9	division, this opening will be publicly posted throughout the
10	sheriff's office for a period of five (5) days to allow all
11	persons eligible to apply for transfer from their division to
12	the division where the opening exists. Those interested should
13	apply in writing to the Sheriff requesting <u>a</u> such transfer.
14	(2) The Sheriff reserves the right to transfer any
15	employee for the betterment of the service; provided, however,
16	the employees shall not be reduced in rank or compensation and
17	such transfer shall not be considered disciplinary in nature.
18	(3)(2) Employment or reemployment to No appointment or
19	$rac{promotion in}{promotion}$ any position in the Sheriff's office shall <u>not</u> be
20	deemed complete until after the expiration of a period of $\underline{1}$
21	one (1) year's probationary service, during which time the
22	sheriff may terminate without cause the employment of any
23	person certified and/or appointed .
24	(4) No promotion shall be deemed complete until after
25	the expiration of a period of 6 months of service during which
26	time the Sheriff may return the promoted person to his or her
27	former rank and pay for failure or inability to perform the
28	duties of the position to which he or she had been promoted.
29	(5)(3) Employment and reemployment Appointments shall
30	be regarded as taking effect upon the date the <u>employee is</u>
31	<u>scheduled to report</u> person appointed reports for duty. A
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1 person offered employment certified by the Sheriff who does 2 not report for duty at the time so designated, and who does not explain his or her said failure to report, in writing, 3 within 5 = five (5) days, may be rejected by the Sheriff. 4 Section 11. Practice and procedures of the board .-- The 5 6 practice and procedure of the board with respect to any 7 investigation by the board authorized by this act shall be in 8 accordance with rules and regulations to be adopted by the board which shall provide for a reasonable notice to all 9 persons affected by recommendations to be made by the board 10 after such investigation, with the opportunity to be heard 11 12 either in person or by counsel. 13 Section 12. Misconduct and misuse of professional 14 influence.--(1) No person covered by this act shall use his or her 15 official position or influence to solicit orally or in writing 16 17 by letter, and no public officer or employee shall receive or 18 be in any manner concerned in receiving or soliciting any money or valuable things from any employee of the Sheriff's 19 office department or political party or private individual for 20 21 any purpose whatsoever. 22 (2) No person shall use or promise to use his or her 23 influence or official position authority to secure any appointment or prospect of appointment to any position 2.4 classified under this act as a reward or return for personal 25 26 or partisan political service. 27 (3) No public officer or employee of the Sheriff's 2.8 office shall by means of threats or coercion induce or attempt to induce any person holding a position in the Sheriff's 29 office to resign his or her position, or to take a leave of 30 absence from duty or to waive any rights under this act. 31 10

1 Section 13. Discipline; suspensions; dismissal; 2 appeals.--3 (1) The sheriff may discipline, suspend up to 30 days 4 without pay, terminate, or withdraw the appointment of or 5 dismiss an employee only for just cause. An employee subject б to substantial discipline, which includes a loss of pay, 7 accrued time, benefits, rank, or position; disciplinary transfer; suspension; or termination may, within 15 days of 8 the discipline, suspension, termination, or withdrawal of 9 10 appointment, file a notice of appeal with the board's secretary. The board shall schedule a hearing within 30 days 11 of receipt of notice of appeal. Continuation of a hearing may 12 13 be granted by the board upon a showing of good cause by either party or upon agreement of the parties. The employee so 14 dismissed or suspended will have fifteen (15) days to file an 15 appeal with the board. Officers with the rank of lieutenant 16 17 and above will have the authority to take immediate disciplinary action including relieving an employee of duty, 18 thereafter securing the approval of the sheriff. The sheriff 19 may summarily suspend an employee for a reasonable period not 2.0 21 exceeding thirty (30) days. Every such suspension shall be 2.2 without pay; provided, however, that the board shall have the 23 authority to investigate every such suspension and if it is found that the sheriff acted in bad faith, it shall have the 2.4 25 power to restore pay to the employee for such suspended time. (1) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this 26 27 section, any person holding a position in the sheriff's office 2.8 who has been removed or discharged, has the opportunity to be heard in his own defense upon filing a written request to the 29 board within fifteen (15) days following the action. The 30 appeal shall, within thirty (30) days after the filing be 31

1 heard, investigated and determined by the board as provided by 2 section 13 of this act. (2) At the hearing the employee has the burden of 3 proving that the Sheriff lacked just cause supported by 4 5 competent and substantial evidence for the disciplinary action 6 under appeal. 7 (3) The board shall have the authority to investigate 8 any such discipline, suspension, termination, or withdrawal of appointment and, should the board determine following a 9 10 hearing that the action taken by the Sheriff was without just cause, the board has the authority to: 11 12 (a) Vacate the discipline, restore the employee's pay 13 and benefits as outlined in subsection (1), and, in the event the suspension is not completed, void the remaining suspension 14 time and restore the employee to duty. 15 16 (b) Reinstate the employee's employment and pay 17 without loss of rank or seniority. 18 In no case shall back pay exceed 30 days. 19 20 (4) Should the board determine following the hearing 21 that the action taken by the Sheriff was with just cause it 2.2 shall uphold the disciplinary decision of the Sheriff. The 23 board may not substitute its judgment for that of the Sheriff regarding the severity of the disciplinary action imposed, 2.4 provided the disciplinary action is authorized by law. 25 (5) Each party may make a timely appeal to the circuit 26 27 court upon receipt of the board's written order. In the event 2.8 a timely appeal is not taken and the Sheriff was found to not have just cause for the discipline, the employee's record 29 shall have the board's final order attached to and included in 30 the employee's personnel file. 31

1 (6) (2) The board's decision is The decision of the 2 board will be final and absolute. 3 (7) Classified employees are free from retaliatory action based on the exercise of rights provided under this 4 5 act. б Section 14. Public meetings .-- It shall be the duty of 7 the authorities having charge of the public buildings of Lee 8 County to allow the reasonable use of public buildings and rooms for the holding of meetings of the board and any 9 examinations or investigations provided for by this act. The 10 term "public building" shall include any building under the 11 12 lawful control of the Lee County Government or Lee County 13 Sheriff's Office which provides for free public access under minimal restrictions, as necessary, to provide for the safety 14 and security of its occupants. 15 Section 15. (1) It shall be and is hereby made the 16 17 duty of the Sheriff of Lee County to provide annually in his 18 budget, a sufficient sum of money to enable the board to properly carry out the purposes of this act. 19 20 (2) Effective October 1, 1986 and thereafter, it is 21 the duty of the Sheriff of Lee County to provide annually in 22 his budget a sufficient sum of money to pay a percentage of 23 the cost of the health insurance of members of the Lee County Sheriff's Office who retire from active service after having 2.4 accumulated at least 15 years of creditable service under the 25 Florida Retirement System. The health insurance costs payable 26 27 pursuant to this section include premiums for major medical 2.8 and hospitalization insurance, but do not include premiums for dental insurance. When a retiree receiving this health 29 30 insurance benefit becomes eligible for Medicare, his health 31

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1 coverage will convert to the Medicare Supplement health 2 insurance. (a) In order to receive this benefit, the retiree must 3 have served with the Lee County Sheriff's Office for the 10 4 years immediately preceding his retirement. The retiree may 5 6 claim up to 5 years of creditable service earned while in the 7 employ of another member agency within the Florida Retirement System. The Lee County Sheriff's Office shall verify all years 8 of creditable service claimed through the Division of 9 Retirement of the Department of Administration. 10 (b) If an employee retires from the Lee County 11 12 Sheriff's Office after at least 10 years of service with the 13 department, but before reaching retirement age, and has participated in the Florida Retirement System for at least 15 14 years, he may pay his and his dependent's health insurance 15 costs until he begins to receive retirement benefits under the 16 17 Florida Retirement System. The Lee County Sheriff's Office 18 shall begin to pay a percentage of the employee's health insurance costs when he begins to receive such retirement 19 benefits. The retiree shall give the sheriff's office written 20 notice of the date of payment of his initial retirement 21 22 benefit. The Lee County Sheriff's Office shall verify this 23 date through the Division of Retirement of the Department of Administration. 2.4 (c) The Lee County Sheriff's Office shall base the 25 percentage of a retiree's health insurance costs it will pay 26 27 upon the number of years of creditable service that the 2.8 retiree has accumulated in the Florida Retirement System. Fifteen years of creditable service entitles the retiree to 29 have 75 percent of his health insurance premiums paid by the 30 sheriff's office. The sheriff's office shall pay an additional 31 14

1 5 percent of the insurance premiums for each year of service in excess of 15 years until reaching a maximum of 100 percent 2 of the premium at 20 years of service. The Lee County 3 Sheriff's Office shall pay an additional one-twelfth of 1 4 5 percent of the premium for each month served until the full 6 100 percent is paid. 7 (d) If an employee has health insurance coverage 8 through a previous employer, the Lee County Sheriff's Office 9 will be the secondary payor. 10 (e) If an employee receives a retiree health insurance subsidy from the state, the Lee County Sheriff's Office shall 11 12 reduce the amount it pays of the employee's health insurance 13 premiums by the amount of the subsidy. (f) The Lee County Sheriff's Office shall pay for the 14 health insurance coverage of the retiree and 50 percent of his 15 or her dependents' health insurance coverage only if the 16 17 retiree's health insurance is paid at 100 percent of the premium at 20 years of service. A retiree who obtains benefits 18 without attaining 20 years of service may pay for the health 19 insurance of his or her dependents. Upon a retiree's death, 20 21 his or her spouse may continue the health insurance coverage 22 previously provided by the retiree. Premiums must be paid to 23 the Lee County Sheriff's Office. (g) This retiree health insurance benefit is only 2.4 available to an employee when he retires. If the employee does 25 26 not elect to receive the insurance benefit upon retiring, he 27 does not have the option of receiving the benefit at a later 2.8 date. Section 16. Political activity .-- No employee person 29 holding a classified position in the sheriff's office shall 30 take an active part in any political campaign while on duty or 31 15

1 while off duty and wearing any uniform or part thereof 2 identifying the Sheriff's office. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit or prevent any such person from 3 exercising lawful political rights while off duty, from 4 becoming or continuing to be a member of a political club or 5 б organization, or from attending any political meetings, or 7 from enjoying entire freedom from all interferences in casting 8 his or her vote. Any person violating the provisions of this section may be dismissed from the service of the office of the 9 10 sheriff of Lee County. Section 17. Legal construction and amendment of the 11 12 act.--The provisions of this act shall be severable and if any 13 of the provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, the decision of the court shall not affect the validity of the 14 remaining provisions. It is hereby declared the legislative 15 intent of this act that it would have been adopted by the 16 17 legislature had such unconstitutional provision not have been 18 included therein. (1) This act shall not be held or construed to create 19 any property rights or any vested interests in any position in 20 21 the Sheriff's office beyond those specifically enumerated in 22 the act sheriff's office and the right is hereby reserved to 23 repeal, alter or amend this act, or any provision thereof at 2.4 any time. 25 (2) All requests for changes or amendments to this act proposed by a board member or an alternate board member shall 26 27 come before the five-member board in a public meeting and be 2.8 approved by a majority vote of the board. The board as a whole has the authority to request the Legislature to amend the act 29 30 on behalf of the classified employees of the Sheriff's office 31

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whose effect on all classified employees shall be immediate upon becoming law. Section 18. All laws and parts of laws, insofar as they are inconsistent with this act, or any provision thereof, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 2978 The Committee Substitute removes the section on retiree health benefits and returns the special act to current law on that subject.
