2 An act relating to airline travel; requiring that, upon the cancellation or delay of a flight by more than 1 hour, 3 4 the airline honor the purchaser's ticket at a later date 5 or reimburse the purchaser the cost of the ticket and pay the purchaser an amount equal to the airline's flight-6 change penalty fee; providing for certain specified 7 exceptions for canceled or delayed flights; defining the 8 9 term "terrorist threat"; providing for additional 10 remedies; providing for an award of damages, costs, and attorney's fees; providing that an airline violating the 11 act more than once within a calendar year commits a 12 misdemeanor of the second degree; providing penalties; 13 providing that there is no expiration date for an airline 14 ticket issued anywhere in the world for an airline flight 15 originating in this state; requiring an airline to accept 16 a nonrefundable ticket under certain circumstances; 17 authorizing an airline to charge a transfer fee; providing 18 19 an exception; providing an effective date. 20 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 21 22 If an airline cancels a flight or delays a 23 Section 1. (1) 24 flight by more than 1 hour, the airline must honor the 25 purchaser's ticket at a later date or reimburse the purchaser 26 the cost of the ticket and pay the purchaser an amount equal to 27 the airline's flight-change penalty fee. The reimbursement for the ticket and payment of the flight-change fee is in addition 28

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29	to any other remedy the ticket purchaser may have against the

31	(2) Subsection (1) does not apply if the flight delay or
32	cancellation is caused by:
33	(a) Inclement weather;
34	(b) An immediate terrorist threat;
35	(c) International conditions that are not related to
36	terrorism, including riots, civil unrest, embargoes, or war; or
37	(d) A condition outside the control of the airline.
38	(3) The term "terrorist threat" means a threat of a
39	violent act or threat of an act that is dangerous to human life,
40	that is a violation of the criminal laws of this state or of the
41	United States, and that is intended to:
42	(a) Intimidate, injure, or coerce a civilian population;
43	(b) Influence the policy of a government by intimidation
44	or coercion; or
45	(c) Affect the conduct of a government through destruction
46	of property, assassination, murder, kidnapping, or aircraft
47	piracy.
48	(4) In addition to any other penalties or remedies
49	provided by law, a person aggrieved by a knowing and willful
50	violation of this section may bring a civil action in a court of
51	competent jurisdiction against the airline for the recovery of
52	actual and consequential damages, court costs, and reasonable
53	attorney's fees.
54	(5) An airline that violates this section two or more
55	times within a calendar year commits a misdemeanor of the second
56	degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
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57 Section 2. (1) There is no expiration date for an airline 58 ticket issued anywhere in the world for an airline flight 59 originating in this state. 60 (2) If the airline ticket is nonrefundable and the ticket 61 purchaser is unable to use the ticket, the airline must allow 62 the ticket to be transferred to another person. The airline may 63 charge the purchaser a processing fee of 25 percent of the original price of the ticket or \$50, whichever is less. A ticket 64 purchaser may not transfer a ticket if the ticket purchaser 65 missed the flight due to the fault of the purchaser. 66 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007. 67

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
